CLERGY REFLECTION

As we begin Lent this week, I'm sure the water-cooler talk at the office is about what people are giving up and the fish sandwiches that will once again be advertised on billboards and TVs alike. While many Catholics know "what" we're called to do during Lent, it is always important to review the "why." Otherwise we can easily end up checking boxes and yet not having any growth in charity, being like a clanging gong (see 1 Cor. 13:1).

Prayer. Fasting. Almsgiving. While they're all important, this ordering, in my opinion, is crucial. The whole point of Lenten practices is for us to grow in holiness. It can be easy enough to say "no" to a hamburger and put some extra money in a collection, but if those practices don't help us to love God and neighbor more, then we become a clanging gong. Prayer ought to be the foundation of our time of Lent. Depending on one's vocation and state in life, time and types of prayer look different, but no one can grow in holiness without a life of prayer.

From the Scriptures we know that Jesus fasted. Through our prayer, we learn how to make our fasts sanctifying. While fasting from a particular food or drink may be what we need to pursue, perhaps we need to fast from something else. To help in this area, consider what areas of sin you struggle with. If you struggle with complaining, fast from complaining. If you struggle with gossip, fast from gossip. You get the idea.

Lastly, when we give to others, we should feel it. Almsgiving ought to put us in contact with our poverty. The Missionaries of Charity (and similar religious orders) are able to serve the poor so easily because they know their own poverty before God, and they also see that Jesus humbled himself to the lowest place. Do not be afraid to let your almsgiving make you uncomfortable.

One final note: choose penances that will challenge you but are possible. If we set the bar too high, we can easily become discouraged. Don't be led to despair if you fall. Rather, imitate Jesus, rise, continue on, and see it as a chance for humility.
