

SECOND READING

Romans 8:31b-34

Brothers and sisters:

He who did not spare his own Son but handed him over for us all, how will he not also give us everything else along with him? Who will bring a charge against God's chosen ones? It is God who acquits us, who will condemn?

Christ Jesus it is who died—or, rather, was raised—who also is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us.

Jesus took Peter, James, and John and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves.

And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no fuller on earth could bleach them. Then Elijah appeared to them along with Moses, and they were conversing with Jesus.

Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Rabbi, it is good that we are here! Let us make three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." He hardly knew what to say, they were so terrified.

Then a cloud came, casting a shadow over them; from the cloud came a voice, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Suddenly, looking around, they no longer saw anyone but Jesus alone with them.

As they were coming down from the mountain, he charged them not to relate what they had seen to anyone, except when the Son of Man had risen from the dead. So they kept the matter to themselves, questioning what rising from the dead meant.







CLERGY REFLECTION

Facing Adversity

As a deacon assigned to Prison Ministry there are times when I receive correspondence through the Cathedral office from offenders that I have previously ministered to. Recently, however, I received a letter in my Cathedral mailbox that was from an offender whom I didn't know and even more puzzling the return address was from a county jail in another state. I opened the six page letter and it was addressed to: "Dear whomever takes time to read this." It was from a man in his early thirties who heard about St. Joseph Cathedral through a friend and felt he should reach out. In the letter he explains a detailed history of his life leading up to his current incarceration. He describes a childhood that consisted of tremendous abandonment and abuse. In his teen years he turned to drugs to medicate the pain but then addiction only compounded the suffering. Inevitably it led to his incarceration.

I share this story because it caused me to reflect on how I handle adversity in my life. When things don't go my way or tragedy strikes, how do I respond? What we are made of manifests when we encounter adversity. In other words, the strengths and weaknesses of our character are revealed.

Abraham in this Sunday's first reading faced a tremendous test of character when he was asked by God to sacrifice his son. After hearing the command that God gives him he does not hesitate to fulfill God's will. As a father, I can't begin to imagine what Abraham was going through. It was his total and complete trust in God that allowed him to offer his son without hesitation. The adversity that he went through was to prove himself worthy of God's great promise for him to be the father of many nations. The same is true for us. The adversity that we experience in this life is meant to prepare us for a life of eternal glory in heaven. When all goes well, we can become complacent in our faith, but that can change when we're facing hard times. Faith, hope, humility and patience can be measured more genuinely when adversity enters our life. Even though it's something that we try to resist with all our might, adversity also can be the very thing that causes greater dependency on God. This was the case with the young man I described above. Through his life of hardship he has now surrendered his life to God, and although he's still suffering from life experiences and the consequences of his actions, he is seeking to imitate Christ in his life.

So as we continue this time of Lenten penitence when we're asked to take up our cross and follow Jesus, let us take comfort in the words of St. Paul in the second reading, "If God is for us, who can be against us."
