Exodus 20:1-17

In those days, God delivered all these commandments: "I, the LORD, am your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, that place of slavery.

You shall not carve idols for yourselves in the shape of anything in the sky above or on the earth below or in the waters beneath the earth; you shall not bow down before them or worship them.

For I, the LORD, your God, am a jealous God, inflicting punishment for their fathers' wickedness on the children of those who hate me, down to the third and fourth generation; but bestowing mercy down to the thousandth generation on the children of those who love me and keep my commandments.

While he was in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, many began to believe in his name when they saw the signs he was doing.

But Jesus would not trust himself to them because he knew them all, and did not need anyone to testify about human nature.

He himself understood it well.







CLERGY REFLECTION

The response to our Set Ablaze "town-hall" meeting on January 23 was exceptional. Around 75 people attended. The group was diverse in background, age and parishioner tenure. Again, the objective was to discuss the five pillars of the Set Ablaze Planning Process: Worship & Liturgy; Discipleship & Evangelization; Service; Community; and Education/Formation. We received a "ton" of input. Much of it creative, inventive and original with a look to the future. Obviously, there were critiques of what we could do better. We split parishioners into small groups and each weighed in on the various pillars given the discussion within their small groups. Then, there was time for each group to present a few points that were discussed at their respective tables. The intent was to gain insight from the parishioners for future long range planning for the Cathedral "pastorate" (Pastorate 21) under the Set Ablaze plan. I thank all those who attended and contributed. I also want to thank Denise Rotert, one of our office volunteers, who compiled the information for easier review.

So, where do we go from here? The information summarized and synthesized to establish goals for the Pastorate 21 portion of the Set Ablaze Pastoral Plan. I am in the process of creating a "Pastorate Committee," who will sit down with me and review the findings. We will be meeting in March and April. Using the information we gathered from the town-hall, and other knowledge and information relative to the state of the parish currently, we will construct a plan of "aspirations" or "goals" with some concrete suggestions on how to accomplish them. The Pastorate Committee will discuss each pillar related to these questions: Where are we today? Where do we want to go from here? What is the roadmap for getting there? and, How do we know if we are succeeding? I ask for your patience, your prayers and support, as we continue this process which is vital to the mission of our parish as the Mother Church, and vital for the good of the Diocese in general.

It's tempting to view Set Ablaze as just another bureaucratic exercise, but far from it, it is a way that we can more truly realize our calling as the Body of Christ, the Church as a faith community working together as a "faith community" out of great love for Our Lord Jesus and His One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church. As we hear from Jesus' own lips today: *Zeal for Your house will consume me.* Zeal for the house of our Pastorate and the Cathedral should be on our lips as well.
