

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

2 Chronicles 36:14-16, 19-23

In those days, all the princes of Judah, the priests, and the people added infidelity to infidelity, practicing all the abominations of the nations and polluting the LORD's temple which he had consecrated in Jerusalem.

Early and often did the LORD, the God of their fathers, send his messengers to them, for he had compassion on his people and his dwelling place.

But they mocked the messengers of God, despised his warnings, and scoffed at his prophets, until the anger of the LORD against his people was so inflamed that there was no remedy.

Their enemies burnt the house of God, tore down the walls of Jerusalem, set all its palaces afire, and destroyed all its precious objects.

Those who escaped the sword were carried captive to Babylon, where they became servants of the king of the Chaldeans and his sons until the kingdom of the Persians came to power.

All this was to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah:

"Until the land has retrieved its lost Sabbaths, during all the time it lies waste it shall have rest while seventy years are fulfilled."

In the first year of Cyrus, king of Persia, in order to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah, the LORD inspired King Cyrus of Persia to issue this proclamation throughout his kingdom, both by word of mouth and in writing: "Thus says Cyrus, king of Persia: All the kingdoms of the earth the LORD, the God of heaven, has given to me, and he has also charged me to build him a house in Jerusalem, which is in Judah.

Whoever, therefore, among you belongs to any part of his people, let him go up, and may his God be with him!"







CLERGY REFLECTION

"Who can utter the mighty doings of the Lord, or declare all his praise? Happy are those who observe justice, who do righteousness at all times." (Ps 106: 2-3).

I would like to share a story of Salama on his Confirmation day. Salama Giakomo Odi was born SEP 22, 1998 in Delle, Eritrea. He is now 26 years old with autism (ASD): unable to speak, sit, move, eat or drink, but could only hear. He always lies down on a bed or on the lap of his mother. His family has never stopped helping him to find a good doctor in Eritrea. They spent lots of money, but things were getting tougher. They were told to take their son to foreign countries to get better treatment, The parents were not legally allowed out of the country by the government. Finally his parents decided to take risk to flee from Eritrea to Sudan then to Ethiopia. They decided to cross the border of Sudan with their 3 kids including Salama to a Refugee camp in Ethiopia. UNHCR helped them to get to Sioux Falls, SD in 2018.

By God's grace Salama got better treatment and he is now fed by internal nutrition. His mother witnessed that his patron saint 'Our Lady of Lourdes' helped him to travel without taking any food. A lot of people discouraged her saying that he will no longer survive. For this and all she celebrates the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes every year.

God bless Fr. James Morgan! One day as he was visiting the sick, he realized that Blessed Sacrament could help him and he gave Salama First Communion, but the challenge was how give him Jesus since he is not eating. Then he had the idea of putting the Blessed Sacrament in a small amount of water to soften it. He used his pinky finger to put it inside his mouth so that he can easily swallow. I also started to do the same, but one day I told him to open his mouth and he received by himself. Surprisingly one day I went to visit him without the Blessed Sacrament and he got mad at me and only his mother knew his sign language. When asked where the Blessed Virgin Mary or Jesus is, he directs his eyes to the picture to Virgin Mary or to the Jesus on the crucifix.

One day I decided to give a tour at the Cathedral of St. Joseph and he was so excited. He wishes to come to the church every Sunday.
