



CLERGY REFLECTION

At the beginning of 2022, the United States bishops, with the hope of creating a movement on a national level for a greater love of the Eucharist and with the hope of forming Eucharistic disciples through ongoing catechesis, announced the "National Eucharistic Revival." The National Eucharistic Revival began in June of 2022 and will culminate in June 2025 with the first Eucharistic Congress held in the nation in 38 years. The Eucharistic Revival challenges Catholics to return to the source and summit of our faith in the worship and adoration of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. Dioceses and parishes across the nation are challenged to experience a profound renewal in the Eucharist through local, grassroots efforts. So, for example, offering Eucharistic Adoration on a regular basis was one of their suggestions. Safe to say, we have been doing that at the Cathedral consistently. We offer Eucharistic Adoration in the Chapel every Thursday evening, and on the First Friday of every month there is adoration at 11 a.m. before Noon Mass. Another suggestion from those leading the charge was to have a speaker designated by the National Eucharistic Revival Committee speak in parishes about the importance of the Holy Eucharist. In January, Sr. Joseph Andrew Bogdanowicz, a Dominican nun from Ann Arbor MI, did a mission at the Cathedral on the Holy Eucharist and its relationship to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Continuing in the spirit of renewal and revival, our next planned endeavor is to have you grow closer to Jesus alongside fellow parishioners through the "Jesus and the Eucharist Study." This bible study was specifically designed for small groups who want to learn more about the Eucharist with a set curriculum to guide them and direct them. We will conduct seven sessions on Thursday night at the parish from April 4 through May 16. Thursday was the chosen day of the week because it allows participants to spend 30 minutes in Adoration as well. Each session is full of rich theological content, powerful testimonials, and unique and timely messages from bishops across the country. This is a great opportunity to dive more deeply into the richness of our Eucharistic faith. The seven sessions are: What's Our Story?; Who is Jesus?; Am I Saved?; Why a Church?; God is With Us; The Story of the Eucharist; and Bread for the Journey. Each session will open with an exhortation from a different bishop, followed by lectio divina prayer with scripture. The main lesson is drawn from content created by the Augustine Institute, and will include personal testimonies from Catholics across the country. There is a transition into small group discussions, and then as I said, time for prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament. Please, consider joining and participating. In today's Gospel Jesus exclaims, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified." Yes, indeed, that hour has come. And to this day we still glorify the Lord Jesus in the Holy Eucharist.
