



THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

Acts 10:34a, 37-43

Peter proceeded to speak and said:

"You know what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him.

We are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree. This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people, but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead.

He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name."

RESPONSORIAL PSALM Psalm 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23 (*Refrain sung first by cantor, then congregation repeat*)



Give praise to the Lord, for he is good; his mercy endures forever. Let the house of Israel say, "His mercy endures forever." **R**

"The Lord's right hand has done mighty deeds; his right hand is exalted." I shall not die, I shall live and recount the deeds of the Lord. **R**

The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone. By the Lord has this been done, a marvel in our eyes. **R**

Brothers and sisters:

Do you not know that a little yeast leavens all the dough? Clear out the old yeast, so that you may become a fresh batch of dough, inasmuch as you are unleavened.

For our paschal lamb, Christ, has been sacrificed.

Therefore, let us celebrate the feast, not with the old yeast, the yeast of malice and wickedness, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

SEQUENCE

Christians, praise the paschal victim! Offer thankful sacrifice!

Christ the Lamb has saved the sheep, Christ the just one paid the price, Reconciling sinners to the Father.

Death and life fought bitterly, For this wondrous victory; The Lord of life who died reigns glorified!

O Mary, come and say what you saw at break of day. "The empty tomb of my living Lord! I saw Christ Jesus risen and adored!"

Bright angels testified, shroud and grave clothes side by side! "Yes, Christ my hope rose gloriously. He goes before you into Galilee."

Share the good news, sing joyfully: His death is victory! Lord Jesus, Victor King, show us mercy.

GOSPEL 1 John 20:1-9

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him."

So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.







CLERGY REFLECTION

Alleluia, He is Risen!

Happy Easter, parishioners and friends of St. Joseph Cathedral. May the peace and light of the Resurrection be your source of true joy! The psalm rings true, "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad."

There are reasons abounding for despair. War, violence, hatred, corruption in institutions, our families, and ourselves. And yet there is a supreme reason for hope: the Resurrection. The Church beckons us, "Rejoice!" Light has conquered darkness. "Death, where is your sting?"

Fr. Francis Sampson, a former military chaplain and priest who served in our diocese, said in one of his final sermons in a POW camp, "The image of the naked Galilean hanging from the cross has always inspired great love and fierce hate. Nero sought to make the cross a hateful image by putting Christians to death upon it, pouring pitch upon them, and lighting Rome with these flaming human crosses. Yet in the end, the Nazorean has always conquered." Tyranny, time and time again, has thought itself to conquer, while time and time again it is conquered. The light shines in the darkness.

One of the most powerful images of the Holy Triduum for me is the procession into the Church during the Easter Vigil Mass. Gathering outside, around the Easter fire, we are then led into a dark church, led only by the smoke of the incense and the light of the Easter candle. Just as the Lord led His people out of slavery by a pillar of fire and a cloud of smoke ages ago, so does the Lord continue to lead us, through and in His Church, from slavery to freedom. As we continue to process into the Church, that one flame from the Easter candle multiplies, as each person's candle is lit from it.

This is evangelization. The testimony of the Lord's disciples attracted others, and the faith spread like a flame spreads—multiplying yet never diminishing. We should never be shy about our faith in Jesus or our membership in His Church, but Easter is particularly a time for us to share the Good News. Jesus is risen. The battle has been won. We have nothing to fear! Jesus gives us reason to hope, even when it seems that darkness abounds. May our witness of joy and hope be a witness of light to a world venturing back into darkness.


