On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Now, Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.







CLERGY REFLECTION

I can hardly believe it's over. When the Holy Triduum begins, I find myself counting down the days to Easter Sunday. Holy Thursday, with the exception of Easter Vigil, is one of the most beautiful liturgies of the four-day celebration, and yet so much work goes into that ONE liturgy that I become exhausted just thinking about the fact that there are four more days to go! By the grace of God we survive, and then like that...it's over. But of course it's not over at all...it's just the beginning, the beginning of new life in the Resurrected Jesus, and living that new life with a sense of intentionality from here on out. It reminds me of the final scenes in the movie, Jesus of Nazareth, when Zerah, the secretary of the Sanhedrin (actually Satan incarnate) learns that the tomb is empty. His words are haunting but revealing: "And so it begins...now it all begins." He realizes that the Resurrection will change the course of the world forever.

With that in mind, let me thank those who contributed their time, talent and energy to make Holy Week and the Triduum a truly memorable experience: A special thank you to Bishop DeGrood for celebrating the sacred liturgies with his Cathedral flock; Fr. Klein for acting as Master of Ceremonies for all the liturgies; Fr. Pasquale for the amazing pastoral/sacramental work he has done with the St. Josephine Bakhita community; Dr. Ostermann, associate organists, cantors and choirs for helping us enter into the sacredness of the Triduum and Easter through the gift of Sacred Music; the lectors, Eucharistic ministers, greeters and altar servers who assisted; the Adoration Sisters and Juan Carlos for making preparations; the Cathedral Men's Group, and other family volunteers who did so much behind the scenes; my staff who went above and beyond the call of duty; last but not least...the ushers, who did double duty at times to ensure that everything was under control.

We brought 36 people into the Catholic Church on Easter Vigil. Six of them were baptized. A truly amazing feat. So let's allow ourselves to bask in the glow of the Easter light, and renew our commitment to the faith, and our dedication to living Gospel principles. It is the community of believers who discover the tomb empty; it is the community of believers whom Jesus appears to post-resurrection; it will be the community of believers proclaiming Christ crucified and resurrected until the end of time, and worship Him as such. We as the community of believers this Easter testify that we have been raised from the ashes once again through our participation at Holy Mass. "Give thanks to the Lord for He is good, His love is everlasting!"


