
This retreat is an opportunity to encounter Jesus through a day of small groups, prayer, speakers and community. We encourage you to bring your mom friends of any faith background. The



CLERGY REFLECTION

I was reading an article which says "Jesus Understands Loneliness" written by Jon Bloom.

In today's Gospel reading we see the apostles filled with loneliness hiding from the Jewish leaders. Jesus, understanding their situation, went to encourage, console and give them peace. But they still were so startled and frightened, thinking they saw a ghost. He said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts rise in your minds?

The same question turns back to us from Jesus when we are terrified and stressed about our different situations. We need to have peace of Christ in our hearts, families and communities. Some feel that they cannot be forgiven; some feel that Jesus will not understand their loneliness.

But Jesus doesn't just understand your loneliness; he's destroying it. Because he died on your behalf, you are no longer truly a stranger or alien, but you are a fellow citizen with the saints and a member of God's family (Eph, 2:19). Because Jesus was alienated from God and man, you will enjoy the full family fellowship of God and all of his redeemed saints forever. Child of God, your loneliness is passing away. The day is nearing when you will know as you have been fully known (1Cor, 13:12). And the fading loneliness you still feel Jesus understands. So "with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that [you] may receive mercy and find grace to help" with every lonely need (Heb, 4:16). As the Divine Mercy promised; let us go and buy the unaffordable blood of Christ without money. The divine love gave us free mercy to save our souls.
