and the life of the world to come. Amen.

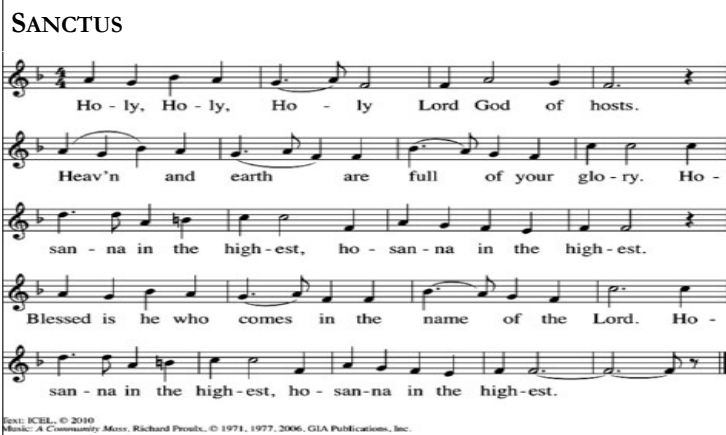

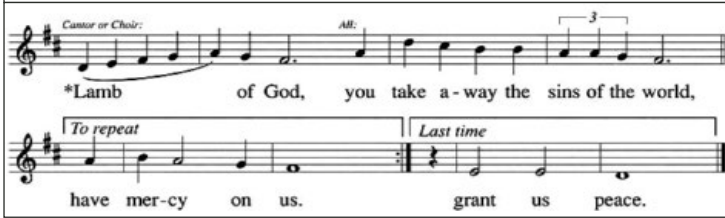

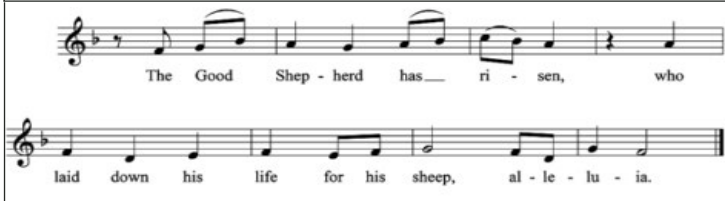

CLERGY REFLECTION

We are probably all familiar with the Good Shepherd narrative. It is always a fruitful reflection. A hired man scatters because he works for pay. There is no real concern for the other. There is only concern for oneself. The hired man is inwardly focused—not willing to place himself in danger. The Good Shepherd, on the other hand, has total concern for the other. There is a lack of emphasis on personal compensation. Rather, there is knowledge of the sheep and a willingness to put himself in the place of danger—not for danger's sake, but out of concern for the sheep. Out of love.

Jesus, the Good Shepherd, is the Good Shepherd because He is also the Lamb. Still in the Easter season, the image of the slaughtered lamb, slaughtered on behalf of the people, should be vivid in our minds. The Easter candle is marked with the Lamb, reminding us that we only come to the glory of the Resurrection because the Lamb of God has been led to the slaughter for us. The Good Shepherd is also the Lamb of God.

Yet I think there is another worthwhile reflection here. Jesus indeed is the Good Shepherd, but are we good sheep? The sheep have various voices calling out to them. There are the voices of the hired workers, there are the voices of other shepherds, and there is the voice of the Good Shepherd. The other voices can be tempting to regard as good. They promise much, but in the time of danger they are found to be empty promises.

While some similarities can be found between us and sheep, one very profound difference is that we have free will. We can choose to follow other voices. We can even choose to hide in the trees where we won't be able to hear the voice of the Good Shepherd, maybe out of fear or shame. Yet this freedom is what can set us apart distinctively. A sheep acts on instinct. We can freely say no to false voices in order to say yes to the voice of the Good Shepherd. We can put ourselves in a place to be found.

While we know that Jesus is the Good Shepherd, may we be humble enough to be good sheep and listen to the voice of the Good Shepherd.
