



THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

Acts 1:1-11

In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen.

He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for "the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

When they had gathered together they asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" He answered them, "It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven."

#### SECOND READING

Ephesians 4:1-13

Brothers and sisters,

I, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to live in a manner worthy of the call you have received, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another through love, striving to preserve the unity of the spirit through the bond of peace: one body and one Spirit, as you were also called to the one hope of your call; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

But grace was given to each of us according to the measure of Christ's gift.

Therefore, it says:

He ascended on high and took prisoners captive; he gave gifts to men.

What does "he ascended" mean except that he also descended into the lower regions of the earth? The one who descended is also the one who ascended far above all the heavens, that he might fill all things.

And he gave some as apostles, others as prophets, others as evangelists, others as pastors and teachers, to equip the holy ones for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until we all attain to the unity of faith and knowledge of the Son of God, to mature to manhood, to the extent of the full stature of Christ.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come.





#### CLERGY REFLECTION

Catholic marriages represent distinctive spirituality that is communitarian, sacramental, and missionary. The covenant established on the wedding day is not merely between two individuals. Rather, it is a spiritual union between man, woman, and God.

Seasons can have an impact on any wedding. Usually if you want to have a holiday wedding, you might have a winter wedding. If you want to have an outdoors wedding, spring, summer and possibly fall are the perfect months. When you decide which type of wedding you want to have, you are also choosing the season. This is important for planning the entire wedding; also the spirituality itself needs a specific season.

Majority of St. Josephine Bakhita weddings are from the Kunama community, and it is a culture shock for me. The Kunama community is used to celebrating their weddings during the summer season, and it is true for everyone around the world. In Eritrea the most known wedding season is around January. Although it might be a little sunny and might not suit the traditional weddings, this time is chosen because of its cultural preferences. This fact is supported by both cultural and economic reasons.

In Eritrea the rainy season is in between May and August so farmer's harvest is mostly from October to late December. For this reason January is the most festive and rich time of the year. 99% of Kunama is a farmer, so it is unusual to plan their weddings in summer season but nowadays weddings are hosted almost any time of the year. Leaving your country teaches you to adapt every situation and culture.

In the Catholic Church, a sacrament is a concrete expression of Christ in the world. Likewise, the Church believes that in marriage, a couple's life and their love should be witnessed by their family and friends. In order to testify to the holy union, family and friends are invited to experience Christ's divine presence and generous contribution to the world. Let us pray for our parishioners who are planning to get married in this year that they may understand and keep their holy union in the grace of God.
