

FIRST READING

Acts 2:1-11

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem. At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language. They were astounded, and in amazement they asked, "Are not all these people who are speaking Galileans? Then how does each of us hear them in his native language? We are Parthians, Medes, and Elamites, inhabitants of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the districts of Libya near Cyrene, as well as travelers from Rome, both Jews and converts to Judaism, Cretans and Arabs, yet we hear them speaking in our own tongues of the mighty acts of God."

SECOND READING Galatians 5:16-25 Brothers and sisters, live by the Spirit and you will certainly not gratify the desire of the flesh.

For the flesh has desires against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh; these are opposed to each other, so that you may not do what you want.

But if you are guided by the Spirit, you are not under the law. Now the works of the flesh are obvious: immorality, impurity, lust, idolatry, sorcery, hatreds, rivalry, jealousy, outbursts of fury, acts of selfishness, dissensions, factions, occasions of envy, drinking bouts, orgies, and the like.

I warn you, as I warned you before, that those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.

In contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law.

Now those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified their flesh with its passions and desires.

If we live in the Spirit, let us also follow the Spirit.







CLERGY REFLECTION

When we look at historical events, one of the temptations can be for us to think that these events are over and done with. Pentecost is indeed a historical event. We know the Apostles, after Jesus' Ascension, remain together with Mary and receive the Holy Spirit upon them at Pentecost. While this is historically true, it is not merely an isolated event in the Church's life. The Holy Spirit continues to sanctify. The Holy Spirit is continually given to ignite hearts, purify souls, and guide the Church.

When we profess in the Creed, "I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic church," it could invite some to pause at the word "holy." After all, an honest study of history can show very unholy things done through members of this Church. In times of significant change, there often results confusion. The Church's members, in these eras, are not immune to being influenced by the spirit of the age. Precisely in these times of apparent scandal from members of the Church, we also see the Holy Spirit stir up in the hearts of her members beautiful and lasting gifts for the Church and the whole world. For example, in a time of decadent lifestyles and some clergy being more concerned with political gain rather than care for souls, the Spirit stirred up in the hearts of men like St. Francis and St. Dominic to transform the culture through poverty and truth. During the Protestant Reformation, when the Church did have need for purification but not to be overthrown, the Holy Spirit inspired the minds and hearts of artists to produce many of the magnificent churches, paintings, sculptures, and compositions that are still marvels today.

There is always reason to hope. This does not mean we are to turn a blind eye to places in the Church - more importantly in our own lives - that need reform and renewal. It does, however, mean that we have faith in Jesus' words - "The Father will give you another Advocate to be with you always, the Spirit of truth." May we never despair but find true hope in the Holy Spirit, which Jesus has promised to send to us if we are faithful to Him and His commands.
