CLERGY REFLECTION

Question: What are the fifteen most powerful words in the English language? Answer: "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." Every Christian knows these words as well as the corresponding motions that typically accompany the words. The words and motion are generally referred to as "The Sign of the Cross" and indeed they are. However, they are also a simple, yet powerful, reminder of the presence of the Blessed Trinity throughout our day.

Whenever a group of Christians gather, no matter what they are doing, when someone begins speaking these words, all snap to attention and join in with what is to be the beginning of a prayer to God. Even most non-Christians recognize "the Sign of the Cross" when they see a person blessing themselves in public.

You cannot watch a baseball game on TV without seeing numerous players make "the Sign of the Cross" when they are about to get in the batter's box or take the mound to pitch, or to give thanks after a successful play.

Although "the Sign of the Cross" is commonly recognized throughout our society, it is often employed without really thinking about what we are doing and what it represents. The motion to this powerful prayer is made in the shape of a cross to remind us of what Christ did for us and of the Trinitarian nature of our God. It is also the shape of a shield to protect us from evil any time we seek God's help and protection in our life.

Additionally, when we make "the Sign of the Cross" in public, it can be a very subtle but powerful means of evangelization. Giving prayerful thanks for a meal in a restaurant is just one example of the opportunities available to us to witness our faith.

On this <u>Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity</u>, let us give thanks to the God who created us, saved us and guides and protects us from evil any time we remain open to his help. And let us not shy away from evangelizing or defending our faith when given the opportunity to do so.
