THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

Exodus 24:3-8

When Moses came to the people and related all the words and ordinances of the LORD, they all answered with one voice, "We will do everything that the LORD has told us." Moses then wrote down all the words of the LORD and, rising early the next day, he erected at the foot of the mountain an altar and twelve pillars for the twelve tribes of Israel.

Then, having sent certain young men of the Israelites to offer holocausts and sacrifice young bulls as peace offerings to the LORD, Moses took half of the blood and put it in large bowls; the other half he splashed on the altar.

Taking the book of the covenant, he read it aloud to the people, who answered,

"All that the LORD has said, we will heed and do."
Then he took the blood and sprinkled it on the people, saying,
"This is the blood of the covenant that the LORD has made
with you in accordance with all these words of his."

SECOND READING

Hebrews 9:11-15

Brothers and sisters:

When Christ came as high priest of the good things that have come to be, passing through the greater and more perfect tabernacle not made by hands, that is, not belonging to this creation, he entered once for all into the sanctuary, not with the blood of goats and calves but with his own blood, thus

obtaining eternal redemption.

For if the blood of goats and bulls and the sprinkling of a heifer's ashes can sanctify those who are defiled so that their flesh is cleansed, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God.

For this reason he is mediator of a new covenant: since a death has taken place for deliverance from transgressions under the first covenant, those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance.

You who all things can and know, Who on earth such food bestow, Grant us with your saints, though lowest, Where the heav'nly feast you show, Fellow heirs and guests to be.

GOSPEL

Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, Jesus' disciples said to him, "Where do you want us to go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?"

He sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the city and a man will meet you, carrying a jar of water. Follow him. Wherever he enters, say to the master of the house,

"The Teacher says, "Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?""

Then he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make the preparations for us there."

The disciples then went off, entered the city, and found it just as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover.

While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said,

"Take it; this is my body."

Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it.

He said to them,

"This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many.

Amen, I say to you, I shall not drink again the fruit of the vine until the day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God." Then, after singing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come.





CLERGY REFLECTION

On Saturday I had the great satisfaction of marrying one of my nieces. In fact, within a month I will marry two nieces and one nephew. Conferring the sacraments on your family members is every priest's dream. Taylor, my niece, married a fine young man named Michael. When I asked Michael during marriage preparation why he wanted to marry her, he said this: "She's the most selfless human being I have ever met." Now of course, anytime you put someone in a position of speaking about another person while they are there, staring you in the face, you are bound to say the most flattering things you can think of. The description "selfless" fits my niece aptly, though, because she is a nurse. My brother told two stories during his father-of-thebride speech to make his point. One had to do with a situation in Boston during a family vacation, when my niece had to perform CPR on a man who had collapsed on the sidewalk. The other story had to do with my mother, who suffered a "mini-stroke" and Taylor just happened to be visiting at the time and came to her rescue. Certainly, care-givers and medical professionals possess a sense of "selflessness" by virtue of their professions. Yet "selflessness" has a spiritual quality to it; one that counters the human desire for self-preservation. We see this quality especially in the Eucharistic Jesus. The Feast of Corpus Christi reminds us of the "selflessness" of the Christ, who shed his blood on the Cross simply out of a profound love for humanity. The act of "selflessness" on the part of Jesus is constant and continuous when you think that He gives Himself to us through the giving of His Flesh and Blood until the end of time. The most Holy Eucharist, the Sacrifice of the Mass, is the source and summit of the Christian life, says the Second Vatican Council. The Eucharist may nourish the spiritual life within us, but more importantly, it conforms us to the person of Jesus, meaning, WE are to become self-less as HE is self-less.

I am edified at the reverence that parishioners show for the Most Holy Eucharist during the reception of Holy Communion at the Cathedral. Whether standing or kneeling; whether receiving on the hand or on the tongue, parishioners understand that they are receiving the True Presence of Jesus Christ, and their demeanor and posture reflects that. Some of our parishioners like to use the altar rail to receive Holy Communion, which is fine. I just ask that if you are coming forward as a family, not to kneel one at a time, but to all kneel together along the rail. It's just helpful for the priests and deacons who are distributing. Whether we kneel or stand, receive on the hand or on the tongue, the point is, we are acknowledging that the Holy Eucharist is Jesus...Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. Amen.
