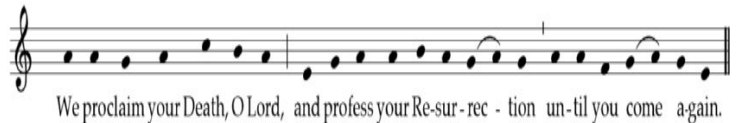

CLERGY REFLECTION

Have you ever experienced tragedy or trouble and asked "Jesus, do you not care that I am perishing?"

I grew up in a village and every summer season our school system gave a long holiday about three months and in this holiday most of the students would go back to their village in order to help their parents, as all of us are involved in farming. I also looked after cattle and when I left the village I would go to the forests with my cattle for the whole three months. Sometimes I go with friends but sometimes I go alone. When there was an opportunity to visit back to my home village I usually planned to go on Sundays because I would like to receive Jesus.

One Sunday as I planned to go back to the village I was alone with my cattle and that very day the clouds were so dark since the morning hours. Everybody was scared that it might rain 40 days and 40 nights. By 10:30 AM, I left my cattle relaxing and went to attend Sunday Mass. When I approached near the cattle the rain started pouring down and it was two hours nonstop rain fall.

I sat near a big stone because if you go under a tree it might fall on you. I stayed there and covered myself with a 2 meter square of plastic sheet. Suddenly a big snake (python) came and wrapped around me which means if I do any movement it is going to swallow me. I can't breathe well and I said "Jesus is it the last day I received you? You want to take me just this blessed Sunday?" After praying the rosary for 30 minutes the python left me and entered into a big pit near the stone and I ran out. I didn't recognize that Jesus was in me helping me, yet. I was still shivering and asking God if I was perishing that day.

Today we learn from the apostles that we should recognize that Jesus is near us and we should have faith during every tragedy.
