

Please, <u>do not</u> take pictures during the Mass celebration. You are welcome to take pictures <u>after</u> Mass.



GOSPEL Mark 5:21-43

When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered around him, and he stayed close to the sea.

One of the synagogue officials, named Jairus, came forward. Seeing him he fell at his feet and pleaded earnestly with him, saying,

"My daughter is at the point of death. Please, come lay your hands on her that she may get well and live."

He went off with him, and a large crowd followed him and pressed upon him.

There was a woman afflicted with hemorrhages for twelve years. She had suffered greatly at the hands of many doctors and had spent all that she had. Yet she was not helped but only grew worse.

She had heard about Jesus and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak.

She said, "If I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured." Immediately her flow of blood dried up. She felt in her body that she was healed of her affliction.

Jesus, aware at once that power had gone out from him, turned around in the crowd and asked, "Who has touched my clothes?"

But his disciples said to Jesus,

"You see how the crowd is pressing upon you, and yet you ask, 'Who touched me?""

And he looked around to see who had done it.

The woman, realizing what had happened to her, approached in fear and trembling. She fell down before Jesus and told him the whole truth.

He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction."

While he was still speaking, people from the synagogue official's house arrived and said,

"Your daughter has died; why trouble the teacher any longer?" Disregarding the message that was reported, Jesus said to the synagogue official,

"Do not be afraid; just have faith."

He did not allow anyone to accompany him inside except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James.

When they arrived at the house of the synagogue official, he caught sight of a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly.

So he went in and said to them,

"Why this commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but asleep."

And they ridiculed him.

Then he put them all out.

He took along the child's father and mother and those who were with him and entered the room where the child was.

He took the child by the hand and said to her,

"Talitha koum," which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!" The girl, a child of twelve, arose immediately and walked around.

At that they were utterly astounded.

He gave strict orders that no one should know this and said that she should be given something to eat.





CLERGY REFLECTION

Farewell to our Cathedral Family

If you have ever talked matters of faith with me or listened to my homilies, you have probably heard me speak of uniting our will with the will of God. Uniformity to God's will for me is an important part of my faith. As Christians we are all called to be imitators of Christ. Jesus says in John 6:38: "For I have come down from heaven not to do my will but to do the will of him who sent me." Being united with the will of our heavenly Father fulfills the purpose for which he created us as it states in the Book of Wisdom in today's first reading, "For God formed man to be imperishable; the image of his own nature he made him." I say all of this with the understanding that following God's will for our lives is easier said than done. Such is the case for Julie and I.

Earlier this year I was approached by the Clergy Council to consider transferring to Pastorate 19, Our Lady of Victory, which consists of St. Michael and St. George parishes. The reason being that the pastorate currently oversees the prison ministry. Since I was assigned to prison ministry when I was ordained, the Council thought it would be beneficial if I was assigned to the pastorate that has oversight of the ministry. Being assigned to Our Lady of Victory pastorate will allow for easier coordination of the various aspects of jail and prison ministry with the priests of the pastorate. I begin my new assignment July 2nd.

When I was asked to consider reassignment, I responded that I was open to whatever God's will was for me as a deacon, understanding that I am under the authority of the Bishop. Having later received word from Bishop DeGrood that I would be reassigned; I saw this as an opportunity to implement in a new way - uniformity to God's will. I truly believe that if we have surrendered every aspect of our lives to God's divine sovereignty, all that happens is either caused or allowed by God which should lead us to praise him in all things.

As I said earlier - it's easier said than done. It's with heavy hearts that Julie and I say goodbye to our Cathedral family. We have been grieving the thought of leaving all of you as we move closer to our last days at the Cathedral. Please keep Julie and I in your prayers as we seek to be obedient to God's will in our lives. Trust that we will never be far from our Cathedral family as we remember you in our prayers. We both want to say thank you for the tremendous blessing you all have been in our lives. The words you have heard me say with all sincerity many times in the Concluding Rite of the Mass I pray for us now - that we may all be at peace and glorify God with our lives.
