



EPHESIANS 1:3-14

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavens, as he chose us in him, before the foundation of the world, to be holy and without blemish before him. In love he destined us for adoption to himself through Jesus Christ, in accord with the favor of his will, for the praise of the glory of his grace that he granted us in the beloved. In him we have redemption by his blood, the forgiveness of transgressions, in accord with the riches of his grace that he lavished upon us.

In all wisdom and insight, he has made known to us the mystery of his will in accord with his favor that he set forth in him as a plan for the fullness of times, to sum up all things in Christ, in heaven and on earth.

In him we were also chosen, destined in accord with the purpose of the One who accomplishes all things according to the intention of his will, so that we might exist for the praise of his glory, we who first hoped in Christ. Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over unclean spirits. "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave. Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them."

So they went off and preached repentance.

The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.



Since then, I have been active in the sacred music program playing organ and singing for Masses. My new position will allow me to give glory to God through sacred music and assist in educating young minds who have the desire to glorify Christ through music.

I completed my Bachelor of Music degree in Piano Performance in 2022 at the University of South Dakota. My education continued at the University of Notre Dame where I completed my Master of Sacred Music degree in Organ Performance this past May 2024. The goal is to have a choir that will rehearse after school hours as well as an option for home educated students to rehearse during the day. I will also be directing the music education for St. Joseph Academy and preparing their choirs to provide sacred music for weekly liturgies. Involvement in sacred music presents an opportunity for education in the Catholic faith, liturgical formation, and direct participation in the Mass. My journey as a church musician has deeply impacted my spiritual and academic education, has resulted in beautiful friendships, and has provided a space to strive for musical excellence with a fruitful purpose. I will continue to seek truth, beauty, and goodness in my work at the Cathedral.
