INTRODUCTION TO NICOLE

"Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while." What an invitation! It almost sounds too good to be true. Jesus isn't one to mince words—He means what He says.

I know many of you are busy with family matters—doing your diligence to raise up the domestic Church. Many of you are diligent in your work. To "come away to a deserted place and rest a while" may sound impossible or like a waste of time when we could get so much done otherwise. However, Jesus doesn't mince words. If we're ever in a place to say, "Your words, Jesus, don't apply to me," we may need to step away and re-examine where we are at. We all need to step away and rest.

As priests, we have the gift that not only are we allowed, we are required, to have an annual retreat. The Church desires that her shepherds have the chance to step away, to re-examine our life and be refreshed in His grace. That's harder for spouses and parents. It may not be impossible, though! I have heard of spouses who each promise each other one weekend a year for them to take a retreat while they take care of family matters for the weekend. With Broom Tree Retreat Center and the Abbey of the Hills in our diocese, we have two opportunities close to home that offer various retreats throughout the year.

Even if that isn't possible for one reason or another, this call remains, and I think it is important to listen to them. Perhaps it is having one day a month you don't use your phone and find some sort of extra time to go to the Lord in prayer. Maybe it is finding one weekend throughout the year where you are able to get away for a day of recollection or a retreat. And while marriage requires love and attention to a spouse and children, which ought not to be rejected, what a great example to kids when mom or dad actually takes a day to focus on their relationship with God in a very intentional way.

God desires our good. He desires our fulfillment. It is with this understanding we must hear Jesus' words. His commands are not burdensome but meant to give us life. May we all be able to heed His words, "to come away and rest."
