



# GOSPEL

John 6:1-15

Please Stand

Jesus went across the Sea of Galilee.

A large crowd followed him, because they saw the signs he was performing on the sick.

Jesus went up on the mountain, and there he sat down with his disciples.

The Jewish feast of Passover was near.

When Jesus raised his eyes and saw that a large crowd was coming to him, he said to Philip,

"Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?"

He said this to test him, because he himself knew what he was going to do.

Philip answered him,

"Two hundred days' wages worth of food would not be enough for each of them to have a little."

One of his disciples, Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, said to him, "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?" Jesus said, "Have the people recline."

Now there was a great deal of grass in that place.

So the men reclined, about five thousand in number.

Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted.

When they had had their fill, he said to his disciples, "Gather the fragments left over, so that nothing will be wasted." So they collected them, and filled twelve wicker baskets with fragments from the five barley loaves that had been more than they could eat.

When the people saw the sign he had done, they said, "This is truly the Prophet, the one who is to come into the world."

Since Jesus knew that they were going to come and carry him off to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain alone.

# INTRODUCTION TO NICOLE

"Why don't we do the 'sign of the peace' in Mass at the Cathedral?" This is a question I field now and then, especially from those outside the Cathedral environ, who may attend Mass in another parish in Sioux Falls or outside of Sioux Falls. It's a legitimate question with a multifaceted answer. First, the sign of peace is always optional. It's a pastoral call then. When I came to the Cathedral in 2015, it was not being initiated by the priest at the altar, so I continued that precedent. The Congregation of Divine Worship in the Vatican, beginning in 2005, studied the necessity of the sign of peace and its location in the Mass. In 2014, the Congregation decided to leave the gesture where it is in the Mass, but emphasized its protocol and its optional character, pointing to the abuses of the gesture which had occurred in the pews since its inception after Vatican Council II. With the proliferation of COVID in 2020, the sign of peace became passe' and unthinkable. Forget about shaking someone's hand, we had to stand 5 feet apart from each other! Even before COVID, many people (especially the elderly) would refrain from offering or receiving the sign of peace during the flu season. It then became awkward to even initiate the gesture from the altar. But it's more than just a health concern. The position of the sign of peace in the Mass is problematic. We are approaching the most sacred moment in the Mass, where Jesus will be elevated as the "True Peace" the "True Presence" in the Holy Eucharist. Calling "time out" at that particular moment in the Mass for the sake of a human gesture substitutes an incredibly sacred, solemn moment for a profane and celebratory one. Logically, it makes no sense when you look at what is happening in the Mass at that moment. However, though the sign of peace is not initiated by the priest at the altar, it doesn't mean that it can't be given, especially between family members and friends who are either in the same pew or directly behind or in front of one another. It's done privately. I see this frequently at Mass and I commend it. It's simple, respectful and quickly brings one's focus back to the altar where the singing of the "Lamb of God" witnesses to the Christian belief that true peace is the gift of Christ's death and resurrection.
