### THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

### FIRST READING

Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15

The whole Israelite community grumbled against Moses and Aaron.

The Israelites said to them,

### GOSPEL

### John 6:24-35

When the crowd saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they themselves got into boats and came to Capernaum looking for Jesus.

And when they found him across the sea they said to him, "Rabbi, when did you get here?"

Jesus answered them and said,

"Amen, amen, I say to you, you are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled.

Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on him the Father, God, has set his seal." So they said to him,

"What can we do to accomplish the works of God?" Jesus answered and said to them,

"This is the work of God, that you believe in the one he sent." So they said to him, "What sign can you do, that we may see and believe in you? What can you do?

### **PROFESSION OF FAITH**





### CLERGY REFLECTIONS

As this is my first bulletin letter at my new assignment to St. Joseph Cathedral, Fr. Morgan thought it would be a good idea if I introduce myself. My name is Deacon Jonathan Eckrich. If that last name sounds familiar, perhaps that's because Fr. Brian Eckrich is my nephew. You might recall, he was assigned here at the Cathedral for a few years.

My wife is Lori. We have three daughters, Leigh (Sioux Falls), Maria (Ruckersville, VA) and Erin (Sioux Falls). We also have two grandsons, Jude and Simon. I grew up in Aberdeen in a family of ten. I received my Masters degree in Computer Engineering from Iowa State University, which by the way, is where I met Lori. She also is an engineer. I have a small company that manufactures specialized switches and digital voice devices for persons with disabilities. Next year, I'll retire from this position, freeing me up for more diaconate duties. Lori and I are grateful to be here, and I look forward to serving the Church here at St. Joseph. Enough about me.

Two recent news stories grabbed my attention. The first was about young adult Catholics in Canada, specifically British Colombia. This demographic (ages 18-34) is twice as likely to attend Mass on at least a monthly basis than is the next older generation. This greatly pleases me. It's so easy for my generation to trash this younger generation. We see this in social media memes all the time. We hear words like, "We had to walk to school, uphill, both ways." And, "My generation had to get up, and flip the turn knob to change the channel on the TV." Well, I'll tell you what, I like this younger generation way more than I like my own. Don't get me wrong, we who grew up in the sixties and seventies have many solid and admirable traits that have largely been forgotten. But we're the ones who forgot our faith. Virtually every one of my high school friends no longer practices his or her Catholic faith, and that's from a Catholic High School.

The second report was about the young families who attended the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis. Many of these families were quite large on today's standards, and many of them were very young. What an amazing and beautiful testament to the love of Church and the love of their children for a husband and wife to take their children to such an event. It's nearly unbelievable to me how those parents could summon the strength and patience to manage the sheer logistics of such an endeavor. It was more important for these parents to expose their children to the deep richness of our Catholic faith than it was for them to get solitude and adequate sleep. So, parents, encourage your children to love their faith, and do so primarily by example. And, if it seems overwhelming at times, know that God will provide.
