



#### CLERGY REFLECTION

## Queen of Heaven, Rejoice! Alleluia!

This is the opening line of the hymn Regina Caeli, which is the Marian hymn for the Season of Easter. While we're far from the Easter Season, this Thursday is the Feast of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Last Thursday we celebrated her Assumption into heaven, and a week later the Church presents us with her title as Queen of Heaven and Earth. We have many titles for Mary: Mother of God, Mother of the Church, and her many apparitions. But why "Queen?"

The modern understanding of a queen is being the wife of the king, with their children being princes and princesses, successors to the throne. In the Ancient Near East, however, the understanding is different. It is not the wife of the king who is the queen. Rather, it is the mother of the king who receives the title. People would go to the queen in order to get requests made to the king. After all, which son can deny the request of his mother?

We see this in 1 Kings. In chapter 1, Bathsheba enters the room and bows to her husband, David, the King. In the next chapter, after David has died, Solomon becomes king. As Bathsheba enters the room, she doesn't bow but is bowed to. Solomon stands and honors her, the Mother-Queen. She enters the room to bring a petition of one of the citizens. He responds, "I will not refuse you."

The request of any mother is powerful. It is true all the more with Mary. She receives our requests and intercessions as our queen—not to grant them herself but to bring them to her Son, the king. As we know we have many needs, as individuals, as families, as a parish, and in our world, may we go to God how He has come to us—through Mary.
