



#### THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

#### FIRST READING

JOSHUA 24:1-2a, 15-17, 18b

Joshua gathered together all the tribes of Israel at Shechem, summoning their elders, their leaders, their judges, and their officers.

When they stood in ranks before God, Joshua addressed all the people:

"If it does not please you to serve the LORD, decide today whom you will serve, the gods your fathers served beyond the River or the gods of the Amorites in whose country you are now dwelling.

As for me and my household, we will serve the LORD."

But the people answered,

"Far be it from us to forsake the LORD for the service of other gods.

For it was the LORD, our God, who brought us and our fathers up out of the land of Egypt, out of a state of slavery. He performed those great miracles before our very eyes and protected us along our entire journey and among the peoples through whom we passed.

Therefore we also will serve the LORD, for he is our God."





#### CLERGY REFLECTION

#### "To whom would we go?" (John 6:68)

Joshua addressed all the people: If it does not please you to serve the LORD, decide today whom you will serve. Today's Sunday readings are reminding us with whom to stand for and what to vote as Christians.

The Chosen people of God and some parishioners have been defending divine law and doing Rosaries; Larry Tentinger and his wife Darlene Tentinger, a well known veteran family from St. Joseph Cathedral, have been helping people to fight with praying Rosaries and by spreading some rosaries to all communities in St. Joseph Cathedral.

Great achievements have been done on different occasions within this month for the same intention.



I, Fr. Pasquale and St. Iosephine Bakhita altar servers had a retreat on August 8th and we were

accommodated fully by Larry's family on his farm and had a great retreat. We did Mass, a Rosary and other activities.

On August 11th I also took some of the St. Josephine Bakhita youth group to Good Earth State Park for a retreat and our main topic and intention was about Amendment G. I came with about 100 rosaries from Larry and before we began our retreat, we blessed the rosaries and started walking through the trails and that was a really wonderful experience praying Rosaries with nature. We had seen hills, river flowing, trees and birds praying with us for two hours and came back to continue our retreat.

Lastly August 18th was a Eucharistic procession in Pierre, South Dakota where people attended devotedly and this shows us that we have chosen Christ who invited us to be His own followers and servers.
