And immediately the man's ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke plainly.

He ordered them not to tell anyone.

But the more he ordered them not to, the more they proclaimed it.

They were exceedingly astonished and they said, "He has done all things well.

He makes the deaf hear and the mute speak."






Joseph Cathedral Children's Choir - provides a space for

CLERGY REFLECTION

I love that Hebrew word "Ephphatha!" "Be Opened!" It rolls off the tongue like the grandiose declaration it is: ef-FA-tha! We are not unfamiliar with this word. Every baptism in the Catholic faith includes what we call the "Ephphatha Rite," or "The Opening." It's one of the last prayers the priest or deacon prays over the child before the final blessing. He first places his thumb on both ears of the baby, and then places his thumb on the baby's lips, saying these words: The Lord Jesus made the deaf hear and the dumb speak. May he soon touch your ears to receive his word, and your mouth to proclaim his faith, to the praise and glory of God the Father. Amen.

Thus, the intention is that the child would grow one day to be not just a "hearer" of the word, but a "doer" of the word. In the Gospel for today, Jesus uses the declaration to open a man's ears so that he might hear what he has never heard before; and removes his speech impediment so that he might speak what he has never been able to utter before: the Good News of the Gospel. The implication is that in the end, the man became a true follower of Jesus, zealously proclaiming Him as Messiah and Lord.

Whatever Jesus did, He did with calculation. He healed in order that people would be active participants in his mission – not just spectators watching on the sidelines, but a player, a member, a person who acts and is involved in the faith. Christ demonstrates both the beauty and goodness of God in His actions. Jesus not only says a command, He does something essentially human. He physically touches him. He puts His fingers into the deaf man's ears and He touches the man's tongue (with His own spittle) to physically identify with this man's infirmity and to awaken faith in him. We are reminded of two points. First, the physical remedy He uses for healing is not unlike the conferring of the Sacraments in our Catholic faith. We use words, actions, AND elements (not spittle; but water, bread & wine, oil) to heal and restore and to build up faith. Christ makes the power and authority of God a tangible reality for us. He's not floating on some cloud in the air, but He is actually present in the sacramental actions that confer grace.

Second, St. Gregory the Great, church father of the 6th century, whose feast day we celebrated last Tuesday, says: "The Spirit is called the finger of God. When the Lord puts His fingers into the ears of the deaf mute, He was opening the soul of the man to faith through the gifts of the Holy Spirit."

It is the finger of God that opens our souls to faith through the sacramental life of the Church; and it is the finger of God that endows us with the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Let us, like the deaf-mute who was healed, have our "hearts" opened to be led by the Spirit; and our "lives" liberated that we might live in the Spirit. Ephphatha!!
