

Jesus and his disciples set out for the villages of Caesarea Philippi.





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

CLERGY REFLECTION

"Who do people say that I am?" (Mark 8:28)

An Eritrean Proverb says "Ear is a stranger to owner" which means your ear can hear everything about others but not about you, the owner, especially when it comes to gossip. Jesus wanted to know something about himself which His ears were not hearing about him.

The proverb "A bad name is worse than bad deeds" means that having a negative reputation for being known as a dishonest or untrustworthy person can be more damaging than actually doing something wrong. The proverb suggests that people's perceptions of you and how others perceive you are often more important than your actions or mistakes. The idea behind this proverb is that a good reputation is valuable and can be difficult to regain once lost. In contrast, the impact of specific actions or mistakes may be more fleeting or easier to overcome.

Talking about someone behind him is not necessarily gossip but if it is negative energy it is gossip and gossip is one of the sins that can easily get you addicted to it. Gossip is like a secret craving. We say we don't like it, but when it's within reach, we almost can't resist it. We get a sudden appetite to know what we don't know... about somebody else.

Proverbs 18:8 says, "The words of a gossip are like choice morsels; they go down to a man's inmost parts." You might say I am not into sharing the dirty details about a person's life just for fun. But gossip comes in many flavors, and it involves listening, as well. Proverbs 17:4 notes: "Wrongdoers eagerly listen to gossip; liars pay close attention to slander." Yikes!

Today's message is what do you say about yourself when people talk about you behind you? What do you tell people when they gossip about their fellow friends and families or someone they know? Whenever we participate in gossip we gossip against Jesus because, Jesus himself said; "whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me."

What do we say about our church and Jesus in our church and other Churches?


What do we say about our bishop and other bishops?
