



#### CLERGY REFLECTION

It is such a common question to ask kids nowadays: "What do you want to be when you grow up?" It's not a bad question, nor is it new. But I do wonder if it is asked more than it used to be. After all, we live in a world that has occupational potentials unknown in former ages. People can live and work in completely different places, working jobs that didn't exist 50 years ago, when the foundational jobs had been those seen around the stained glass windows of St. Joseph and the Blessed Mother in our cathedral. Certainly new work has arisen as the world has changed so rapidly, which is not an evil thing!

All of that being said, I think there is a question largely unasked today—certainly in the world, but unfortunately also in many of our own homes and parishes. That question is: "God, what are you calling me to in life? How are you calling me to love and serve you?" It's a related question to the first, but it goes deeper. The first question assumes we know what we truly desire. The second acknowledges that God may have something in store for us deeper than we even know.

I returned this week from Rockford, IL, where my sister took her final vows as a cloistered nun. I was moved in the Mass beyond what I can convey here in words, but I will do my best! Very few, if any, little girls would ever respond to the first question above by saying, "When I grow up, I want to wear a crown of thorns." Yet, over the course of my sister's own vocational discernment, she wanted nothing less than to be united with Jesus, even in suffering. And so, while most brides are adorned with a veil on their wedding day, she took up a crown of thorns to wear for the day, showing her union with Him even in suffering. (Don't worry, the crown doesn't actually pierce the skin or hurt—she assured my very curious nephews of that). Surrounded with her sisters, they taught the rest of us what it means to be full of joy and full of life, even adorned with a symbol of the Passion.

Just because little girls don't respond to that question with this type of an answer doesn't mean they don't desire it. But we are often too shy or afraid to ask the question. We should not be afraid to ask the question, "What do you think God is asking of you?" to young people. We never want to force anyone into any vocation. Freedom is an essential part of discipleship, nonetheless vocational discernment. But many religious or seminarians acknowledge that they first started taking the call seriously when someone asked if they had ever considered it.

While we continue to pray for an increase in holy vocations in our diocese, may we also have the courage and prudence to ask others, and ourselves, "God, what are you calling me to in life?"
