CLERGY REFLECTION

This summer I had a four-day silent retreat at a retreat center in Minnesota. The spiritual director, Fr. Hank asked me if I did any kind of recreation. I do a number of activities, but I wouldn't really call them recreation. So, he advised me to find something recreational and do it. So, I dusted off my bow and headed to the archery range; I've been there several times. I also have been to the driving range (golf) several times. Fr. Hank knew the importance of recreation to one's mental and spiritual health.

Starting this Monday, September 30, Clergy Days 2024 begins. It will last until Thursday, October 3. It's held at Cedar Shores Resort just on the other side of the river from Chamberlain. Until I attended my first one in 2021, I really didn't have a clear understanding of what Clergy Days was. So, I thought this might be a good opportunity to explain Clergy Days to you.

As Fr. Hank directed me to find or make some recreation in my life, so Bishop DeGrood desires this for the priests of the diocese. All priests in active ministry are pretty much required to go to Clergy Days, for recreation and relaxing, but also for learning and spiritual growth. Deacons are strongly encouraged to go, but it can be difficult because of commitments to their secular jobs.

Think of Clergy Days as a working vacation. We attend educational sessions, talk business as it relates to our parishes and pastorates and tend to various other ecclesial interests. But we also pray a lot together, we visit with clergy friends we don't see often. We relax, we rest, and we find recreation. Some of us hit the links for a round or two of golf. There's an archery range very nearby. I know Bishop DeGrood likes to get some jogging in. I even know a priest who does some fishing on the river.

In my career, over the decades, I've worked with lazy people and I've worked with "workaholics." None of them I would characterize as happy people. The lazy ones spend much of their time trying to mitigate the guilt they feel deep down stemming from their lack of productivity. The overworkers work long hours much out of insecurity of 'looking bad' in front of the boss. Both of these groups of people lack balance, and hence are not fully realizing Happy, Healthy and Holy in their lives.

Our bishop understands the vital necessity of being Happy, Healthy and Holy, words we've heard often over the past few years. These virtues (or personal attributes) are optimized when we have a prudent balance between work and recreation – take that word apart sometime; "re-create." We know our priests work hard. We see it every day. So, while they are at Clergy Days, hold them up in your prayers. Ask God to optimize Happy, Healthy and Holy for each one of them.
