



# GOSPEL

Mark 10:17-30

As Jesus was setting out on a journey, a man ran up, knelt down before him, and asked him, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus answered him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You shall not kill; you shall not commit adultery; you shall not steal; you shall not bear false witness; you shall not defraud; honor your father and your mother." He replied and said to him, "Teacher, all of these I have observed from my youth." Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said to him, "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." At that statement his face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions. Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!" The disciples were amazed at his words. So Jesus again said to them in reply, "Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." They were exceedingly astonished and said among themselves, "Then who can be saved?" Jesus looked at them and said, "For human beings it is impossible, but not for God. All things are possible for God." Peter began to say to him, "We have given up everything and followed you." Jesus said, "Amen, I say to you, there is no one who has given

up house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not receive a hundred times more now in this present age: houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and lands, with persecutions, and eternal life in the age to come."

# **PROFESSION OF FAITH Please Stand** I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. 



# CLERGY REFLECTION

# "Sell what you have, and follow me"

A very big challenge to most Christians of our generation is following Christ with whatever we have. In 1 Timothy 6:10 it says "For the love of money is the root of all evil". Then following Christ with whatever we have is that we follow our Lord with all the evil we have.

A statement of Jesus 'Sell what you have' spiritually sounds repentance, deliverance from every evil, to clean your heart and to have a charitable heart. Growing up in the society which values money more than anything else is not easy to give away what you have, but still this generation wanted to serve God with their sin. Followers of Christ wanted to follow Jesus by acting and leaving against him. True Christian never brings excuses and never justifies his sins and addictions but nowadays Christianity has become ideological party so that everyone can come with his/her ideology and make a group.

For St. Francis Assisi was one of great followers of Christ who left wealth and chose poverty. For St. Francis poverty was more than just an absence of material wealth; it was a spiritual state that brought one closer to God. He believed that by renouncing worldly goods and embracing a life of simplicity, one could experience spiritual richness. The teachings of St. Francis were deeply rooted in Scripture and the Christian tradition. He drew inspiration from the Gospels, particularly from the life of Jesus Christ, who lived in poverty and preached love and compassion for all.

A young man approached Jesus asking how to inherit the kingdom of heaven and to know his status or present situation so that he can be assured for his future life.


Jesus told him to sell out what he has and this is still related to Matthew 16:24, where Jesus says "If anyone wishes to come after Me, he must deny himself, and take up his cross and follow Me."

A true disciple of Christ is one that does follow him in duty, and shall follow him to glory. He is one that walks in the same way Christ walked in, is led by his Spirit, and treads in his steps, wherever he goes. Let him deny himself. If selfdenial be a hard lesson, it is no more than what our Master learned and practiced, to redeem us, and to teach us. Let him take up his cross.

This it tells us that Jesus Himself is more than the luxurious life we have, so if we choose heavenly luxury, which is Jesus, we don't need earthly luxury.
