CLERGY REFLECTION

You might recall that in January we began the Set Ablaze Pastoral Planning with a town-hall gathering of parishioners from all walks of life. Around 100 people attended to give input to the questions posed to every parish by the Diocese regarding the five pillars of Set Ablaze: Worship & Liturgy; Discipleship & Evangelization; Service; Community; and Schools & Education. The mountain of information from that town-hall was compiled, calculated and categorized. From that report, and input from the Pastorate Planning Committee, a Set Ablaze Pastoral Plan for the Cathedral Pastorate was created and submitted in May.

So, briefly, let me touch on the "aspirational goals" of our Pastorate in a general manner. For the first pillar, Worship & Liturgy: To become THE Cathedral in the United States renowned for restoring the sacred and beautiful within the liturgy, fulfilling in a concrete way the objectives of Sacrosanctum Concilium of Vatican Council II. For the second pillar, Discipleship & Evangelization: To provide more solid catechetical and formational programming for our families, and as the Mother Church of the Diocese, to create an "Institute for Catholic Culture" on our campus making the Cathedral the center of Discipleship & Evangelization. For the third pillar, Service: To make our parish/pastorate more aware of the corresponding need for outreach within our parish and within the Sioux Falls community, taking into account our unique demographic within the parish, and the unprecedented growth of the city. For the fourth pillar, Community: To take advantage of the diverse demographics within our parish that have the potential of creating greater unity and collaboration among parishioners...and...to use our unique role as a civic and historical icon to create community outside of our parish. For the fifth pillar, Schools & Education: To rebuild our religious education programs from the ground up, while utilizing our educational apostolates (St. Joseph Academy and homeschooling groups on campus) and the Bishop O'Gorman Catholic School System to augment a spirit of Catholic culture within our parish.

For all of these "aspirational goals," we provided a roadmap of sorts as a means of a measuring tool. The good news is that we are already achieving some, if not many of these goals in a practical way. In fact, in a certain sense, Set Ablaze is validating much of the progress and development that has occurred in the parish over the past few years. The Pastorate Committee will continue to monitor our Set Ablaze plan so that we can become a Pastorate alive with the presence of Jesus Christ, and confidently approach the throne of grace.


