THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

1 Kings 17:10-16

In those days, Elijah the prophet went to Zarephath. As he arrived at the entrance of the city, a widow was gathering sticks there; he called out to her, "Please bring me a small cupful of water to drink."

She left to get it, and he called out after her,

"Please bring along a bit of bread."

She answered, "As the LORD, your God, lives, I have nothing baked; there is only a handful of flour in my jar and a little oil in my jug. Just now I was collecting a couple of sticks, to go in and prepare something for myself and my son; when we have eaten it, we shall die."

Elijah said to her, "Do not be afraid. Go and do as you propose. But first make me a little cake and bring it to me. Then you can prepare something for yourself and your son. For the LORD, the God of Israel, says, *'The jar of flour shall not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry, until the day when the* LORD sends rain upon the earth."

She left and did as Elijah had said.

She was able to eat for a year, and he and her son as well; the jar of flour did not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry, as the LORD had foretold through Elijah.

Hebrews 9:24-28

Christ did not enter into a sanctuary made by hands, a copy of the true one, but heaven itself, that he might now appear before God on our behalf.

Not that he might offer himself repeatedly, as the high priest enters each year into the sanctuary with blood that is not his own; if that were so, he would have had to suffer repeatedly from the foundation of the world.

But now once for all he has appeared at the end of the ages to take away sin by his sacrifice.

Just as it is appointed that human beings die once, and after this the judgment, so also Christ, offered once to take away the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to take away sin but to bring salvation to those who eagerly await him.

CLERGY REFLECTION

In September, Dr. Ostermann, I and members of the organ committee visited the "organ shop" of Juget-Sinclair in Montreal to get a close up view of our organ in bits and pieces waiting to be put together. The intricacies, details and skill that go into making a handmade organ beginning with raw, organic materials and evolving into a crafted instrument are mind-boggling.

Last week I flew to Richmond, VA to participate in the festivities of the dedication of a new organ for the Cathedral of Sacred Heart in Richmond. Juget-Sinclair, the designers and builders of our new organ also designed and built the new organ for the Richmond cathedral. Dr. Ostermann accompanied me, along with Dan & Pam Boyum, who serve on the Organ Committee and Parish Council respectively. This gave us the chance to see what a dedication of a new organ consists of. It also gave us another opportunity to visit with our organ builders as the construction of our organ continues in full swing as we speak.

In Richmond, the festivities began with Vespers (Evening Prayer), showcasing their new organ. It followed with a concert the next evening by the chief organist of Notre-Dame in Paris (with the Cathedral of Notre-Dame de Paris in restoration after the devastating fire, Olivier Latry has been touring the world giving concerts). The next day, Dr. Ostermann was allowed to play the new Gallery organ to get a feel for a Juget-Sinclair organ, though ours will be different in style and voice. Handmade organs of a world class variety are custom built for the space they inhabit. There are no two in the world that are built alike. The Cathedral of Sacred Heart is a similar design to our cathedral. It is of the same genre of architecture - French Renaissance - though ours, due to the restoration, is more elegant and has better acoustics...that's my biased opinion anyway. It was a rewarding trip and we came home feeling more comfortable about what is ahead for us.

On another note: I am penning this on Tuesday, Election Day. Deacon Radio had some interesting words in his homily last Monday. To paraphrase, he spoke of "the divisions in our nation, and the pensive climate in which we live, it's enough to make us wonder, who is speaking the truth? There is only one truth, and that truth is Jesus Christ." Indeed, now that the election is over, no matter what the outcome, Jesus Christ has won the war but the battle continues for His sake and for the sake of the Gospel. We pray that God's will be done no matter who is ruling or what laws have changed. As St. Paul says, this is what we hold onto, no matter what: "Jesus Christ will appear a second time, not to take away sin but to bring salvation to those who eagerly await him."
