CLERGY REFLECTION

Every Thanksgiving in Ipswich, the Morgan boys would put on a colorful array of uniforms old and new advertising a cross section of teams from high school, college and pro teams, thus commencing the annual Morgan Thanksgiving football game. When we were young, it was quite competitive, with feats of play that I believe today would make the ESPN top ten list. As we entered post-secondary education and beyond, it seemed like the pomp and circumstance outweighed anything that happened on the field, like running around in our backyard waving a large Notre Dame flag while singing the ND fight song at the top of our lungs (at least singing the words that we could remember, and humming the rest). As we got older it became a competition to see who could come up with the most outrageous uniform. I always wore my dad's old baseball spikes, worn thin from games of yesteryear. Everybody wanted to be the champ, the king. One year that all changed. As we were doing pregame warm-ups somebody slipped and pulled a groin muscle, another sprained an ankle, and a third one hurt his back. The other two found themselves without a team. The game hadn't even started and the disabled list was almost full. We went from "kings" to "chumps." The writing was on the wall. We had gotten too old and too out of shape to play the annual game anymore. Human fragility had caught up with us. We may grasp for glory here in this world, but what we truly long for, and what can only bring true fulfillment is to be less than "kings" in the next.

On this Christ the King Sunday, Pilate engages Jesus in a dialogue about "just what kind of a king He is." The contrast between these two kingships is evident. Pilate fails to grasp the real meaning of the Lord's words: *My kingdom does not belong to this world*. Unlike earthly kingdoms, the Lord's is everlasting. Its power comes from the Spirit, and it initiates believers into a realm of love and truth. Yet, as the Lord says, His kingdom has "already come." That is, it's in the here and now, within the physical realm of our earthly existence. Christ is the ruler and king of our lives and of our hearts. Everything we have belongs to the king, and we desire to do and give everything out of love for Him. Perhaps this is why Thanksgiving Day falls within the week of Christ the King Sunday, so that our thanksgiving may be directed towards the King of Kings and the Lord of Lords.
