



THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

Isaiah 62:1-5

For Zion's sake I will not be silent. for Jerusalem's sake I will not be quiet, until her vindication shines forth like the dawn and her victory like a burning torch. Nations shall behold your vindication, and all the kings your glory; you shall be called by a new name pronounced by the mouth of the LORD. You shall be a glorious crown in the hand of the LORD, a royal diadem held by your God. No more shall people call you "Forsaken, " or your land "Desolate, " but you shall be called "My Delight," and your land "Espoused." For the LORD delights in you and makes your land his spouse. As a young man marries a virgin, your Builder shall marry you; and as a bridegroom rejoices in his bride so shall your God rejoice in you.

RESPONSORIAL PSALMPsalm 96:1-2, 2-3, 7-8, 9-10(Refrain sung first by cantor, then congregation repeat)



O sing a new song to the Lord; sing to the Lord, all the earth. O sing to the Lord; bless his name. **R**

Proclaim his salvation day by day. Tell among the nations his glory, and his wonders among all the peoples. \mathbf{R}

Give the Lord, you families of peoples, give the Lord glory and power; give the Lord the glory of his name. \mathbf{R}

Worship the Lord in holy splendor. O tremble before him, all the earth. Say to the nations, "The Lord is king." He will judge the peoples in fairness. \mathbf{R}

Brothers and sisters:

There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit;

there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone.

To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit.

To one is given through the Spirit the expression of wisdom; to another, the expression of knowledge according to the same Spirit;

to another, faith by the same Spirit; to another, gifts of healing by the one Spirit;

to another, mighty deeds; to another, prophecy; to another, discernment of spirits; to another, varieties of tongues; to another, interpretation of tongues.

But one and the same Spirit produces all of these, distributing them individually to each person as he wishes.

Gospel

Јони 2:1-11

Please Stand

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there.

Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine."

And Jesus said to her,

"Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come."

His mother said to the servers,

"Do whatever he tells you."

Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them,

"Fill the jars with water."

So they filled them to the brim.

Then he told them,

"Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it.

And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from

— although the servers who had drawn the water knew —, the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now."

Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

CLERGY REFLECTION

As I'm writing this, the contractors are putting the finishing touches on the rectory. With the removal of the barriers and the cones, it's been a treat to have the parking lot functional once again, and to see the exterior of the rectory in all its historic glory. Fiegen Construction and the subcontractors have gone above and beyond the call of duty to ensure that the project is completed with perfection in mind. They have treated it like it's their baby. At some point, we will list all the subcontractors involved who were so generous with the project.

I am well pleased with what I see. It's been a long time coming, I know. But our motto has been from the beginning, if we are going to do this, let's take the time to do it right. Remember, it's an old building (1922-25) that has had little improvements since the 1960s and 70s, so the complexities of restoration were challenging ten times over.

There are so many to thank for the success of this project. I will start with our parishioners and benefactors: Thank you for your generosity and investment in this important project for the good of the Cathedral and the glory of God. So many, within the parish and outside of the parish, stepped up to make this a reality. I want to thank the parish Capital Campaign Committee and the Catholic Foundation of Eastern South Dakota, for the many hours and visits spent ensuring the funding for this project (and the organ project too). Thanks to both the Parish Council and the Finance Council for their vital input. Last but not least, I want to thank the parish Building Committee: Bob Binstock, Mark Hardie, Terry McMahon, Jon and Jesse Schmidt, Doug Schoenfelder, Mark Weber and Neil Zimmer. I especially want to thank Bob Binstock who served as our "de facto, in-house project manager." Bob has been at the rectory daily since the restoration began, overseeing the work on behalf of the Cathedral. There were many days and many nights Bob was at the rectory volunteering his own time.

Once completed, we will schedule Open Houses allowing parishioners and the public to walk through and see the finished project. We will take two Sundays in a row and allow people to walk through in between Masses. The plan is that Father Pasquale and I would move in after that. There is no projected date, but it will be coming soon. Thank you...and thank St. Joseph the Worker and the Miraculous Infant Jesus of Prague, who walked the halls ensuring its success.
