

LITURGY GUIDE – February 9, 2025 Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time





FIRST READING

Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8

In the year King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord seated on a high and lofty throne, with the train of his garment filling the temple. Seraphim were stationed above. They cried one to the other, "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts! All the earth is filled with his glory!"

At the sound of that cry, the frame of the door shook and the house was filled with smoke.

Then I said, "Woe is me, I am doomed! For I am a man of unclean lips, living among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!"

Then one of the seraphim flew to me, holding an ember that he had taken with tongs from the altar.

He touched my mouth with it, and said, "See, now that this has touched your lips, your wickedness is removed, your sin purged."

Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying,

"Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?"

"Here I am," I said; "send me!"

SECOND READING

1 Corinthians 15:1-11

I am reminding you, brothers and sisters, of the gospel I preached to you, which you indeed received and in which you also stand.

Through it you are also being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you, unless you believed in vain. For I handed on to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures; that he was buried; that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures; that he appeared to Cephas, then to the Twelve.

After that, Christ appeared to more than five hundred brothers at once, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep.

After that he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one born abnormally, he appeared to me. For I am the least of the apostles, not fit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace to me has not been ineffective. Indeed, I have toiled harder than all of them; not I, however, but the grace of God that is with me. Therefore, whether it be I or they, so we preach and so you believed.

GOSPEL LUKE 5:1-11

While the crowd was pressing in on Jesus and listening to the word of God, he was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret.

He saw two boats there alongside the lake; the fishermen had disembarked and were washing their nets.

Getting into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, he asked him to put out a short distance from the shore.

Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat.

After he had finished speaking, he said to Simon,

"Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch."

"Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught

nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets." When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing.


PARISH ANNOUNCEMENTS

CLERGY REFLECTION

Time for God

I guess most of us think the same about time. One day I was reflecting on time and also complained that I have not enough time to pray and after that I read a book that tells the time we are living in is not ours but God's. We borrow time from God or we get time that God provided and we own it saying that we have no time for God. This means we completely forget that the time is given to us by God and negotiate in his own time.

We live in a physical world with its four known space-time dimensions of length, width, height (or depth) and time. However, God dwells in a different realm, the spirit realm beyond the perception of our physical senses. It's not that God isn't real; it's a matter of His not being limited by the physical laws and dimensions that govern our world (Isaiah 57:15). Knowing that "God is spirit" (John 4:24), what is His relationship to time?

The Psalm 90:4 uses a simple yet profound analogy in describing the timelessness of God: "For a thousand years in Your sight are like a day that has just gone by, or like a watch in the night." The eternity of God is contrasted with the temporality of man. Our lives are but short and frail, but God does not weaken or fail with the passage of time. The Lord does not count time as we do. He is above and outside of the sphere of time. God sees all of eternity's past and eternity's future. The time that passes on earth is of no consequence from God's timeless perspective. A second is no different from an eon; a billion years pass like seconds to the eternal God.

So, what is time? To put it simply, time is duration. Our clocks mark change or, more precisely, our timepieces are benchmarks of change that indicate the passage of time. We could say, then, that time is a necessary precondition for change and change is a sufficient condition to establish the passage of time. In other words, whenever there's change of any kind we know that time has passed. We see this as we go through life, as we age. And we cannot recover the minutes that have passed by.

Additionally, the science of physics tells us that time is a property resulting from the existence of matter. As such, time exists when matter exists. But God is not matter; God, in fact, created matter. The bottom line is this: time began when God created the universe. Before that, God simply existed. Since there was no matter, and because God does not change, time had no existence and therefore no meaning, no relation to Him.

In today's Sunday, gospel when the passage says that apostles left everything and followed Jesus, their time is also included. It teaches us to follow Jesus by giving our time to God.

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
