#### CLERGY REFLECTION

Last weekend, we had our first public tour of the newly restored Cathedral rectory, and we are hosting a second open house this weekend. If you haven't already seen it, I invite you to do a "walk-through" to see the results of your investment. Volunteers are stationed throughout the rectory to help guide you. Bob Binstock our "de facto" Project Manager will be available to answer any questions. My only request to parents with children, is to please be cognizant of their little hands and their little feet. The rectory is now furnished and we want to keep things as clean and pristine as possible (wink).

As I said last Sunday, the intent from the beginning was to restore the rectory to its classical-historical style. The contractors and subcontractors went out of their way to ensure that the project was done according to that vision and intent. With the exception of the chapel and the garage, the original floor plan is intact. You will notice that most of the wood floors are original. The fireplace in the dining room (which now works) is original. We were able to use surplus marble left from the Cathedral restoration for the chapel. We are still putting some finishing touches in different areas. You may notice some anomalies. They are there to remind us that the building is 100 years old, and to give the building some "character."

People asked "why so many bedrooms?" Remember, the idea from the outset was to provide a place of hospitality for visiting priests – from within and outside the Diocese. Their fee for an overnight is to pray for the parishioners and benefactors who made the restoration possible. Please note as you tour, the Cathedral Quilters designed custom quilts for each of the beds in the bedrooms. As it says on the corner of the quilts, they "prayerfully quilted each one by hand." A big thank you to them. To our parishioners and other benefactors outside the parish who supported and helped with the project in so many different ways – I thank you from the depths of my heart, the depths of my being. I cannot even find the words to express my gratitude.

With the rectory restoration completed, we have kept the legacy of the Cathedral's beauty and history intact. Future priests of the Cathedral will benefit from our generosity and foresight for years to come. One last thought: Today, Elizabeth Strutz, our parishioner, will be touring the rectory with her son, Matt. Matt, a Cathedral product, was the superintendent from Fiegen Construction who oversaw the restoration project. Like Bob, he practically slept here for two years. Thank you Matt. And thank you Elizabeth, for bringing Matt into the world. Little did he know that God would use him to oversee our project.
