




PENITENTIAL ACT

FIRST READING

Acts 10:34a, 37-43

Peter proceeded to speak and said:

"You know what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him.

We are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree. This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people, but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead.

He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name."

SECOND READING

1 Corinthians 5:6b-8

Brothers and sisters:

Do you not know that a little yeast leavens all the dough? Clear out the old yeast, so that you may become a fresh batch of dough, inasmuch as you are unleavened. For our paschal lamb, Christ, has been sacrificed. Therefore, let us celebrate the feast, not with the old yeast, the yeast of malice and wickedness, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

SEQUENCE

Christians, praise the paschal victim! Offer thankful sacrifice!

Christ the Lamb has saved the sheep, Christ the just one paid the price, Reconciling sinners to the Father.

Death and life fought bitterly, For this wondrous victory; The Lord of life who died reigns glorified!

O Mary, come and say what you saw at break of day. "The empty tomb of my living Lord! I saw Christ Jesus risen and adored!"

Bright angels testified, shroud and grave clothes side by side! "Yes, Christ my hope rose gloriously. He goes before you into Galilee."

Share the good news, sing joyfully: His death is victory! Lord Jesus, Victor King, show us mercy.

Gospel

1 John 20:1-9

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him."

So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.





Once again, we certainly know how to celebrate the Holy Triduum here at the Cathedral. I'm very proud of you for entering into this most sacred of celebrations so faithfully and spiritually. In the midst of the Triduum we discover the crucified Jesus...and the resurrected Jesus...Amen!! A heartfelt thank you to Fr. Klein for his liturgical skills at work as Master of Ceremonies, and for his work and preparation with the Pontifical Servers; To Fr. Pasquale for his leadership with the Bakhita community; To the choir, Dr. Ostermann, and all the musicians for helping us enter into the Easter mysteries so reverently; To Heidi Solem and the Parish staff, the Adoration Sisters, and all who volunteered to help out with the liturgical preparations and ministries during Holy Week, including Juan Carlos Rivera, our Cathedral custodian; To the ushers, lectors and EMs... THANK YOU! Without you, the Triduum celebrations would not have been as majestic, uplifting and inspiring as they were.


I remember a Protestant Minister once commenting on Mel Gibson's "*The Passion of the Christ.*" He said that he wished that there would have been more on the resurrection, and less focus on the gory details of Christ's suffering. Of course, the movie wasn't about the resurrection; it was about the suffering and crucifixion of Christ, hence, the title "*The Passion.*" Read the Gospels and you find that more words are spent -2 to 1 - on the passion and death of Jesus than on the resurrection of Jesus. The Gospels focus on Christ's Passion and Death for a reason: It is the definitive, complete self-giving of the Son on the Cross that brings us forgiveness of sins, and assures us of our redemption. Without the Cross, there is no Crown.

With that being said, though, it's easy to understand his point: The death of Christ is not the end of the story. If we don't believe that Christ rose from the dead, then to be Christian is meaningless. Taken as a whole, as we must, the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus is a mystery. We shouldn't fret if we can't totally wrap our minds around it, nor be skeptical when Jesus comes to us, as He so often does, shrouded in messiness and mystery. It's a gift of faith...like so many other things that make us Christian. If some small encounter during the liturgies this past week has brought us closer to God, then perhaps that's all we need in order to reassure us that Christ has defeated sin and death.

The tomb is empty. He is risen. Let us live as if we believe that.
