**THE LITURGY OF THE WORD**

**FIRST READING**

**Acts 13:14, 43-52**

Paul and Barnabas continued on from Perga and reached Antioch in Pisidia. On the Sabbath they entered the synagogue and took their seats. Many Jews and worshipers who were converts to Judaism followed Paul and Barnabas, who spoke to them and urged them to remain faithful to the grace of God.

On the following Sabbath almost the whole city gathered to hear the word of the Lord.

When the Jews saw the crowds, they were filled with jealousy and with violent abuse contradicted what Paul said. Both Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly and said, "It was necessary that the word of God be spoken to you first, but since you reject it and condemn yourselves as unworthy of eternal life, we now turn to the Gentiles. For so the Lord has commanded us, I have made you a light to the Gentiles, that you may be an instrument of salvation to the ends of the earth."

The Gentiles were delighted when they heard this and glorified the word of the Lord.

All who were destined for eternal life came to believe, and the word of the Lord continued to spread through the whole region.

The Jews, however, incited the women of prominence who were worshipers and the leading men of the city, stirred up a persecution against Paul and Barnabas, and expelled them from their territory.

So they shook the dust from their feet in protest against them, and went to Iconium.

The disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.

## CLERGY REFLECTION

### “Pilgrims of Hope: the Gift of Life”

As we remember the World Day of Prayer for Vocations in our prayers to promote vocations to the priesthood, religious life and diaconate. Especially prayers of mothers in our parish for all mothers to wish their kids all the best through intercession of our mother, Blessed Virgin Mary.

To share my vocation and my mother's prayer part of it looks like this: our vocations basically start when we are very young before we experience or test the sweetness of the world, I was a sixth grader when I first wanted to join seminary, but it was too late for me to apply and a priest in charge of vocations in the diocese told me that I was too young and I had to be patient for one more year. While I was in government public boarding school I used to serve him as an altar server. Requesting my mom for prayer, I could easily join seminary after two years experiencing boarding school. As student I was focusing on my studies until I finished eleventh grade. Continuing Philosophy and Theology I was prayerful and also kind of hiding my identity so that not even my family members could know what will be my final decision. With all this my mother and both of my grandmothers, who are still alive, were praying for my ordination.

It was after my diaconate ordination my mom told me that she had prayed and fasted for me. She even gave me a test to prove either I will be a priest or not without my notice and told us when we all gathered at dinner.
