THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

Acts 15:1-2,22-29

Some who had come down from Judea were instructing the brothers, “Unless you are circumcised according to the Mosaic practice, you cannot be saved.”

Because there arose no little dissension and debate by Paul and Barnabas with them, it was decided that Paul, Barnabas and some of the others should go up to Jerusalem to the apostles and elders about this question.

The apostles and elders, in agreement with the whole church, decided to choose representatives and to send them to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas.

The ones chosen were Judas, who was called Barsabbas, and Silas, leaders among the brothers.

This is the letter delivered by them:

“The apostles and the elders, your brothers, to the brothers in Antioch, Syria, and Cilicia of Gentile origin: greetings. Since we have heard that some of our number who went out without any mandate from us have upset you with their teachings and disturbed your peace of mind, we have with one accord decided to choose representatives and to send them to you along with our beloved Barnabas and Paul, who have dedicated their lives to the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

So we are sending Judas and Silas who will also convey this same message by word of mouth:

‘It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us not to place on you any burden beyond these necessities, namely, to abstain from meat sacrificed to idols, from blood, from meats of strangled animals, and from unlawful marriage. If you keep free of these, you will be doing what is right. Farewell.’”

CLERGY REFLECTION

Our new Pope, Leo XIV, received the papal ring and the papal pallium on Sunday as a sign of his installation as the Bishop of Rome and the Vicar of Christ on earth. Pope Leo is not wasting any time making his presence known on the world stage. During his homily at his inaugural Mass he called for “greater unity and communion” within the Church. He has welcomed the opportunity to help broker peace in the Ukrainian/Russian conflict. In his first general audience he appealed for peace in the Holy Land. These issues, and many more, will be at the center of his pontificate as the “fisher of men” attempts to bring “the hope of the Gospel to humanity,” as he stated in his inaugural homily.

The papal ring and papal pallium are symbols of the Pope’s episcopal prominence. The ring, also known as the “Fisherman’s Ring,” is a gold ring worn by the Pope that symbolizes his authority as the heir to St. Peter. The ring features an image of St. Peter fishing from a boat. The Pope’s name is inscribed on the ring in Latin. I remember kissing the ring of St. Pope John Paul II when I first met him while attending seminary in Rome. I, along with several other seminarians, served Mass for him where he ordained three bishops. The year was 1998, and I was humbled to be serving Mass for him. What I distinctly remember, as I took his hand to kiss the Fisherman’s Ring, was its simplicity: a crude etching of a boat with a stick man in it. The stick man, of course, representing St. Peter, and the boat representing the Church (Mark’s Gospel: “I will make you fishers of men”). Each Pope, however, receives his own custom-designed ring that reflects his own style and personality. When a Pope dies the ring is removed from his hand and smashed with a hammer, to symbolize the vacancy of the Chair of St. Peter.

The pallium is a white band collar worn by the Pope, and worn by metropolitans and primates (archbishops of major archdioceses). The pallium is woven from lamb’s wool and decorated with six black crosses. The wool is shorn from sheep on the feast of St. Agnes. The pallium represents that the Pope is not only a “fisher of men,” but he also represents the “Good Shepherd shouldering the lambs of God.” It is unknown exactly when the pallium was first introduced, although Tertullian wrote an essay in 220 A.D. titled *On the Pallium*. The papal ring probably dates to the middle ages, although the first mention of it is included in a letter written by Pope Clement IV around 1265 A.D.

These symbols of the papacy may seem incidental to us but they have deep theological and historical meaning. Let’s continue to pray for Pope Leo, that he will shepherd Christ’s Church with wisdom and insight.
