CLERGY REFLECTION

“See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are.”

These words are from the First Letter of St. John, and they are fitting words to consider on this joint Trinity Sunday/Father's Day. We just celebrated Pentecost, a feast focused on the mission of the Holy Spirit. We have numerous feast days focused on the mission of the Son—Christmas, the entirety of the Triduum, Ascension, Christ the King, etc. Yet, we have very few feasts that directly call our attention to the Father. Yet every action of each of the Three Divine Persons is an act of the entirety of the Trinity. Thus, today, on Trinity Sunday, we can be reminded that the work of Jesus and the Holy Spirit is always directed at our union with the Triune God.

Many religions invoke God as “Father.” As the Catechism of the Catholic Church explains, this is because “the deity is often considered the ‘father of gods and of men.’ In Israel, God is called ‘Father’ inasmuch as he is Creator of the world” (CCC 238). As Christians, we still profess God as Creator, and so that attribution of Father still holds, but for us it goes deeper. God reveals Himself as Trinity—that He is a communion of persons. Just as the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are one, so is God's desire for us to be one with Him. The family is a reflection of the Trinity.

Looking at our earthly fathers, we can see that we did not earn life. We were entirely receptive in receiving it. Likewise, looking at our heavenly Father, we see that we don't earn divine life. We don't earn the love of God. It is freely offered—and can be received or denied. While each of us have had different experiences of fatherhood—some nearly perfect, some far from perfect, most somewhere in-between—we all share the gift of divine adoption by the Father. The missions of the Son and the Holy Spirit reveal this to us. We are worth saving, and that gift is not earned.

On this Trinity Sunday, I hope that all of the fathers (and future fathers) of our parish may see their great role in their families and the Church. Earthly fathers are the first glimpse of aspects of the heavenly Father. It doesn't require your perfection, but it does require your fidelity! May we all see what love the Father has truly given us, in being called children of God.
