
Celebrant: Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

CLERGY REFLECTION

Dear Cathedral Parish,

Fr. Morgan has given me his bulletin letter this week for an update on our organ project. At the beginning of June I went to visit the shop in Montreal accompanied by a group from our Cathedral Choir. We were able to see the nearly completed instrument (picture below), and I got to play some of the finished parts of the instrument. It is difficult to put into words everything you experience on a trip like that – but the #1 thing that stands out to me is that we have an incredible team working for us in Montreal. They have skills in woodworking, metalworking, and instrument design that have been passed down from generation to generation of organ builders, over centuries. History comes alive as they work, but at the same time you see state-of-the-art technology like CAD design, CRC machines, computer memory banks, and carbon fiber components. It's a fascinating mix of ancient and modern. In all of it, the goal is to make the best possible instrument for the coming centuries – every tiny detail has to be exactly right. That kind of quality control is impossible to impose from the outside – it comes from their own love of the craft and their pride in perfecting their skills.

Soon the whole parish will see and hear the fruits of the tens of thousands of man hours that have gone into our new instrument. You will begin to see construction soon, in July, as we prepare the loft and remove the current organ. Then, in September you will see the construction process for the new organ.

Please be patient during the disruptions, and pray for the success of the project this year!
