




# PENITENTIAL ACT

# FIRST READING

Acts 12:1-11

In those days, King Herod laid hands upon some members of the Church to harm them.

He had James, the brother of John, killed by the sword, and when he saw that this was pleasing to the Jews he proceeded to arrest Peter also.

-It was the feast of Unleavened Bread.-

He had him taken into custody and put in prison under the guard of four squads of four soldiers each.

He intended to bring him before the people after Passover. Peter thus was being kept in prison, but prayer by the Church was fervently being made to God on his behalf.

On the very night before Herod was to bring him to trial, Peter, secured by double chains, was sleeping between two soldiers, while outside the door guards kept watch on the prison.

Suddenly the angel of the Lord stood by him and a light shone in the cell.

He tapped Peter on the side and awakened him, saying, "Get up quickly."

The chains fell from his wrists.

The angel said to him, "Put on your belt and your sandals." He did so.

Then he said to him, "Put on your cloak and follow me." So he followed him out, not realizing that what was

happening through the angel was real; he thought he was seeing a vision.

They passed the first guard, then the second, and came to the iron gate leading out to the city, which opened for them by itself.

They emerged and made their way down an alley, and suddenly the angel left him.

Then Peter recovered his senses and said,

"Now I know for certain that the Lord sent his angel and rescued me from the hand of Herod and from all that the Jewish people had been expecting."

# CLERGY REFLECTION

I think the most freedom I ever experienced was during those first two weeks of summer after elementary school let out. All the commitments that go with being a student were gone for an entire summer. I had the whole summer to look forward to, to do pretty much whatever I wanted without the encumbrance of academic responsibilities.

That experience of liberty was strong the first few weeks of summer because I didn't have a sense of the finality of summer. It was as if it would last forever. I lived *in the moment*. I never pondered how short summer really was. . . until the end of June. That's when I inevitably realized that one third of my summer was already gone, yet it felt as if it had only just begun.

Through July, I felt that same sense of liberty but it was diminished because I was even more aware that my summer was limited. This put a little cloud over me. I lost some of that casual, *laissez-faire* spirit. I lost some sense of living in the moment. And, in August, with only two weeks of summer left, it was all but gone. All I could do was lament how quickly my summer slipped by and how little remained. I stopped living in the moment.

We are now at the end of June. One third of this summer is already gone. This is a good time to check ourselves to make sure we aren't lamenting memories or regrets of the past, or worrying about future challenges. Live in the moment – enjoy today as it is, a unique gift from God. If you want something to feel as if it will last forever then the thing to do is to make it timeless. One does this by living in the moment.

*"The Practice of the Presence of God"* is a book by the seventeenth century French discalced monk, Brother Lawrence (Paraclete Press version is best). The book shares Brother Lawrence's life of contemplating God's presence continually throughout the day. Like golf, it's a simple concept to fathom, but difficult to master. Whatever your "handicap" is, this summer, spend some time in contemplative prayer.

To God there is no past and there is no future; there is only the *eternal present*. We can share in this divine and eternally present moment when we Practice the Presence of God. This is the great fruit of contemplative prayer.
