

The seventy-two returned rejoicing, and said,

Jesus said, "I have observed Satan fall like lightning from the sky.

Behold, I have given you the power to 'tread upon serpents' and scorpions and upon the full force of the enemy and nothing will harm you. Nevertheless, do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice because your names are written in heaven."







CLERGY REFLECTION

On two Saturdays in June, the Cathedral priests said five Masses on the Cathedral campus. Five Masses in one day! I bring this up because it's important to know that there is a lot happening, daily, at the Cathedral. You probably already know that. Yet, please pray for your priests and deacons. At times it can be a bit overwhelming when you add in everything else that is expected of us.

However, like the Psalmist who penned today's psalm, we "cry out to God with joy!" Why? Because doing God's work as ministers of His Word and Sacrament is living and effective, like the results that the 72 disciples witness in today's Gospel. Many times we don't see these results, but we still trust that God is doing His work through the power of the Holy Spirit. This is what we call the "gift of faith." Not only priests and deacons, but all the faithful of the Church pray for "results" in their lives, and many times God seems silent on the issue. Remember though, if God ever ignored us, we would cease to exist. He affirms us with our every heartbeat. He speaks to us on His terms all the time, and I don't mean just through His creation. He speaks to us by the gift of faith that He has given us. He speaks to us from every sacramental we have ever gazed upon. But most of all He speaks to us from the Chalice on the altar which contains the Blood that Jesus willingly shed for us.

Think of this: We are attracted to "the good" in things and then love them for that reason. But when God loves things, He makes them lovable just by loving them. When we look at a crucifix and see how much He loves us, we grasp just how lovable we are! All of this is Jesus speaking to us. But we have to be focused on Him and not what we "want" from Him. As for the good feelings that we want, the Lord obviously has not determined that they would be the best for us at any given time, but still has a plan to grant us His consolation. St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta never experienced consolation in prayer for 20 years, yet Our Lord still spoke to her through the invisible graces she still received. I'm sure if she were here, she would tell us that such gratification is worth waiting for.

And so, let me quote from one of my favorite scripture passages: "Rejoice in hope, endure in affliction, and persevere in prayer" (Rom. 12:12).

And never, never give up!
