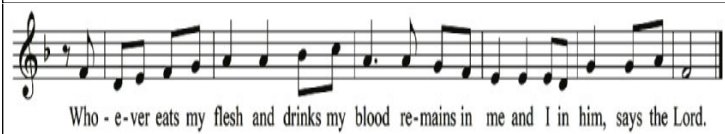

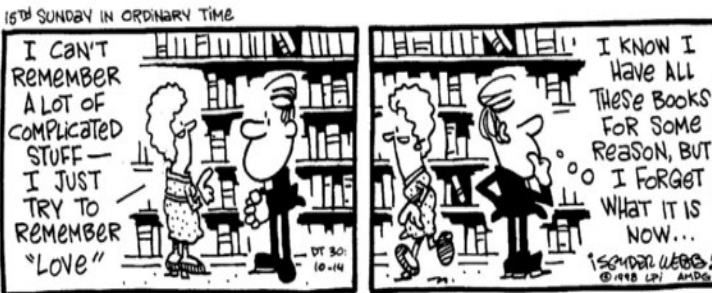

CLERGY REFLECTION

Dear brothers and sisters,

On Monday of this week we celebrate the feast of St. Kateri Tekakwitha. She is the first Native American to be recognized a saint by the Catholic Church. While a majority of saints were from Europe many centuries ago, St. Kateri stands as a witness for us that all are called to a life of sanctity, not just the Bishops, missionaries, and religious of time past.

Kateri was born in 1656 to an Algonquin mother and a Mohawk father. As a young child, she contracted smallpox. While she survived the outbreak, her parents did not. She was raised by an uncle, a Mohawk chief. Others had plans for her life, even to the point of proposing a particular man to be her husband. Kateri refused to marry. She had some exposure to Christianity, and at age 19 she converted to Catholicism.

This was not received well by her community. Rumors were spread and her reputation was tarnished. Knowing she wanted to be faithful to Christ, she found a community of native Christians, served by the Jesuits, that she joined. Due to ill health, and perhaps extreme mortification, she died at the age of 24.

In addition to being from the New World, I think St. Kateri is a poignant example for us in two particular ways:

First, she endured persecution from those closest to her. Her own family mocked her and tainted her reputation. Many of us may receive that same persecution for trying to live out the faith. Whether it is being mocked for making time to go to Mass on Sunday, for praying before meals, or for not participating in the sinful actions of others, we can be persecuted by those closest to us. The example of St. Kateri, like that of Jesus himself, inspires us to persevere in the good even in these circumstances.

The second witness of her life is that she knew her need for others. In enduring persecution, she knew that to learn the Christian life, she needed others around her. In finding her Christian native community, she learned the Gospel, not just through words, but through the way of life. We are all influenced by those who surround us. When we seek to surround ourselves by those who live uncompromisingly for Christ, we change. We become more like them, meaning we become more like Christ.

Through her example and intercession, may we learn from St. Kateri's faith and courage, and believe deeply that sanctity is possible for each one of us.
