

Help keep our Cathedral tidy by utilizing the waste baskets found near the main entrances. Please, do not take pictures during the Mass celebration.



FIRST READING

Genesis 18:1-10a

Looking up, Abraham saw three men standing nearby. When he saw them, he ran from the entrance of the tent to greet them; and bowing to the ground, he said:

"Sir, if I may ask you this favor, please do not go on past your servant. Let some water be brought, that you may bathe your feet, and then rest yourselves under the tree. Now that you have come this close to your servant, let me bring you a little food, that you may refresh yourselves; and afterward you may go on your way."

The men replied, "Very well, do as you have said."

Abraham hastened into the tent and told Sarah, "Quick, three measures of fine flour! Knead it and make rolls."

He ran to the herd, picked out a tender, choice steer, and gave it to a servant, who quickly prepared it.

Then Abraham got some curds and milk, as well as the steer that had been prepared, and set these before the three men; and he waited on them under the tree while they ate.

They asked Abraham, "Where is your wife Sarah?" He replied, "There in the tent."





CLERGY REFLECTION

I have learnt and have come to realize that the Kunama weddings are more expensive to the extent that men have to work as truck drivers for some years for them to get married.

I was investigating the youth in the community about why they can't get married but living together. Their first answer is that they can't afford because it has a lot of expenses. The question is 'who is pushing them to expand their weddings?' It is tradition of the community to legalize that you are married by inviting and feeding the whole community. It is not a must to have this kind of a big wedding in a sacramental marriage.

On June 28, 2025 we had six couples' marriage con-validations for elders and it was a simple and wonderful celebration.

Marriage Matters - because it is a bond between a man and a woman. The Church has taught through the ages that "Marriage is an exclusive relationship between one man and one woman." (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, Marriage: Love and Life in the Divine Plan, p. 7). Christian marriage is not about celebration or feasting but sacramental Marriage is the "foundation for the family, where children learn the values and the virtues that will make good Christians as well as good citizens." Marriage is one of the Church's sacraments. "As a sacrament, marriage signifies and makes present to the couple Christ's total self-giving love."

I have decided to help the community to not waste their money in useless things and especially I encourage the couples who live together, without sacramental marriage, in order to get easy way to join church sacraments. Many of them say that they don't want to come and attend Mass without receiving Blessed Sacrament. A group wedding will help a lot of refugees to get financial freedom and to raise their children with Christian values.
