

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

Genesis 18:20-32

In those days, the LORD said: "The outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah is so great, and their sin so grave, that I must go down and see whether or not their actions fully correspond to the cry against them that comes to me. I mean to find out."

While Abraham's visitors walked on farther toward Sodom, the LORD remained standing before Abraham. Then Abraham drew nearer and said: "Will you sweep away the innocent with the guilty? Suppose there were fifty innocent people in the city; would you wipe out the place, rather than spare it for the sake of the fifty innocent people within it? Far be it from you to do such a thing, to make the innocent die with the guilty so that the innocent and the guilty would be treated alike! Should not the judge of all the world act with justice?"

The LORD replied, "If I find fifty innocent people in the city of Sodom, I will spare the whole place for their sake." Abraham spoke up again: "See how I am presuming to speak to my Lord, though I am but dust and ashes! What if there are five less than fifty innocent people? Will you destroy the whole city because of those five?"

He answered, "I will not destroy it, if I find forty-five there." But Abraham persisted, saying "What if only forty are found there?"

He replied, "I will forbear doing it for the sake of the forty." Then Abraham said, "Let not my Lord grow impatient if I go on. What if only thirty are found there?"

He replied, "I will forbear doing it if I can find but thirty there." Still Abraham went on, "Since I have thus dared to speak to my Lord, what if there are no more than twenty?"

The LORD answered, "I will not destroy it, for the sake of the twenty." But he still persisted: "Please, let not my Lord grow angry if I speak up this last time. What if there are at least ten there?"

He replied, "For the sake of those ten, I will not destroy it."

Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples."

He said to them, "When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread and forgive us our sins for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us, and do not subject us to the final test."

And he said to them, "Suppose one of you has a friend to whom he goes at midnight and says, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread, for a friend of mine has arrived at my house from a journey and I have nothing to offer him,' and he says in reply from within, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been locked and my children and I are already in bed. I cannot get up to give you anything.'

I tell you, if he does not get up to give the visitor the loaves because of their friendship, he will get up to give him whatever he needs because of his persistence.



CLERGY REFLECTION

Just recently, I re-read a delightful book entitled "**Humility Rules**" by J. Augustine Wetta, O.S.B. Wetta is a Benedictine monk who is very insightful, easy to read and blessed with a great sense of humor. Being a Benedictine, he is well-schooled in the highly respected Rules of St. Benedict.

In this book, the author explains many of the rules with the emphasis on the humility they require and many practical ways to become more humble. A week ago I spent my time making a retreat at the Benedictine Abbey in Schuyler, Nebraska. It was a blessed time of prayer and reflection. One of the things that was foremost in my prayer was the need to be humble in all my relationships, especially with God. As Christians, we should all be striving to approach others with humility and to humbly serve God. This book offers some very practical suggestions on how we can become more humble. Here are a few of the suggestions offered in the book:

Secretly do someone else's chores.

The next time you see something not done your way, leave it be if it works.

The next time someone treats you unfairly (cuts in front of you, plays loud music, eats something that was yours, etc., etc.), smile and thank God for them.

Smile at someone who doesn't look like they are going to smile back.

Deliberately walk (or drive) behind someone that is slow.

Clean a toilet.

Drive somewhere with the radio and cell phone turned off.

Spend an entire day without looking at a screen.

The next time someone annoys you, don't tell anyone.

These are just a sampling of the suggestions the author offers as the reader navigates through the book. I promise you will find the book enjoyable and inspirational. I also promise that if we do the things suggested in this book, with the proper attitude, we will become a more humble people because of it.
