
Wisdom 18:6-9

SECOND READING

HEBREWS 11:1-2, 8-19

Brothers and sisters:

Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen.

Because of it the ancients were well attested.

By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; he went out, not knowing where he was to go.

By faith he sojourned in the promised land as in a foreign country, dwelling in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs of the same promise; for he was looking forward to the city with foundations, whose architect and maker is God.

By faith he received power to generate, even though he was past the normal age—and Sarah herself was sterile—for he thought that the one who had made the promise was trustworthy.

So it was that there came forth from one man, himself as good as dead, descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sands on the seashore.

All these died in faith.

They did not receive what had been promised but saw it and greeted it from afar and acknowledged themselves to be strangers and aliens on earth, for those who speak thus show that they are seeking a homeland. If they had been thinking of the land from which they had come, they would have had opportunity to return. But now they desire a better homeland, a heavenly one. Therefore, God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared a city for them.

By faith Abraham, when put to the test, offered up Isaac, and he who had received the promises was ready to offer his only son, of whom it was said,

“Through Isaac descendants shall bear your name.”

He reasoned that God was able to raise even from the dead, and he received Isaac back as a symbol.

Jesus said to his disciples:

“Who, then, is the faithful and prudent steward whom the master will put in charge of his servants to distribute the food allowance at the proper time?

Blessed is that servant whom his master on arrival finds doing so.

Truly, I say to you, the master will put the servant in charge of all his property.

But if that servant says to himself, ‘My master is delayed in coming,’ and begins to beat the menservants and the maidservants, to eat and drink and get drunk, then that servant’s master will come on an unexpected day and at an unknown hour and will punish the servant severely and assign him a place with the unfaithful.

That servant who knew his master’s will but did not make preparations nor act in accord with his will shall be beaten severely; and the servant who was ignorant of his master’s will but acted in a way deserving of a severe beating shall be beaten only lightly.

Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more.”



CLERGY REFLECTION

It was my first and a great experience of administering the Sacrament of Confirmation at St. Ambrose Cathedral in the Diocese of Des Moines, Iowa.

Can. 883 §2. "For a grave cause the bishop and even the presbyter endowed with the faculty of confirming in virtue of the law or by the special grant of the competent authority can in single cases also have associate presbyters with themselves to administer the sacrament."



I was given this great opportunity according to canon law, but being in charge of giving the Holy Spirit is not something to be taken lightly. It makes you first fill yourself with the Holy Spirit, staying fully in the grace of God and know that a strong power will come out from you to the candidates. Even though I personally enjoyed feeling like a bishop (one of the apostles), I also came to know the yoke and burden of the bishops is not easy when they administer the sacraments. Many people do not understand that being a bishop involves a dual responsibility of serving both God and people within their diocese including the priests of the diocese. A true and devoted Christian is the one who understands and prays for the church and church leaders but not the one who figures out the faults or mistakes of personnel within the diocese, pastorate or parish.

The Church and every Christian is called to be submissive to Christ and to the Holy Spirit so that the Holy Spirit leads us in the truth and keeps consecrating us daily.



Bishops serve God by: representing Christ, upholding the Apostolic mission, teaching the truth and by sanctifying the people. We are called to pray for the church and church leaders; for prayer is one of the great tools of the mission. I also encourage you to keep praying for Bishop DeGroot's good health, when we warmly welcome him back.

The Holy Spirit never sleeps but is always a burning fire holding the church and converting lots of hearts.
