THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

JEREMIAH 38:4-6, 8-10

In those days, the princes said to the king:
"Jeremiah ought to be put to death; he is demoralizing the soldiers who are left in this city, and all the people, by speaking such things to them; he is not interested in the welfare of our people, but in their ruin."
King Zedekiah answered: "He is in your power"; for the king could do nothing with them.
And so they took Jeremiah and threw him into the cistern of Prince Malchiah, which was in the quarters of the guard, letting him down with ropes.
There was no water in the cistern, only mud, and Jeremiah sank into the mud.

Ebed-melech, a court official, went there from the palace and said to him:
"My lord king, these men have been at fault in all they have done to the prophet Jeremiah, casting him into the cistern. He will die of famine on the spot, for there is no more food in the city."
Then the king ordered Ebed-melech the Cushite to take three men along with him, and draw the prophet Jeremiah out of the cistern before he should die.





CLERGY REFLECTION

Brothers and sisters,

If you'll allow me to live in the past a bit, I'd like to look back on a feast day from last week. The Church celebrates the feast of St. Clare on August 11th. A 13th Century contemporary of St. Francis, she went to him to say that there were women who also wanted to live a regulated life dedicated to God in a similar way that he was doing. Thus, her order, the Poor Clares, began.

Some of you know that my sister is a Poor Clare. My parents and I went out to visit her last week, being able to be present on St. Clare's feast day. The local bishop celebrates the Mass every year on August 11th, and he preached of her spiritual motherhood. He referenced that St. Clare has been revered as "the mother of many virgins." That line struck me, and I have continued to reflect on it since then.

Though not all, many of you are mothers or fathers. If I had to guess, a majority of you who read the bulletin have grown children out of the house. St. Clare was and is a mother to many, while herself not having any biological children. The Church speaks well in regards to spiritual motherhood and fatherhood. It is particularly emphasized in priesthood and religious life, where "mother" and "father" are particular titles used, but there is also an element of spiritual motherhood and fatherhood for all of you.

I look back now at the number of older parishioners from my time growing up at my home parish and see how motherly and fatherly many of them were to me. Of course I had my parents who did much of the heavy lifting, but so many people of the parish cared for us children as spiritual mothers and fathers—in their prayers, in their attentiveness to us, in their service of us, and in the witness of their own faith. Do not overlook your role in evangelization, even if the young people around you in these pews are not of your own family line. May St. Clare, and the countless other spiritual mothers and fathers in heaven pray for us to fulfill this!
