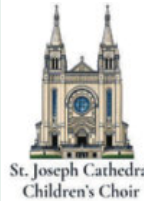

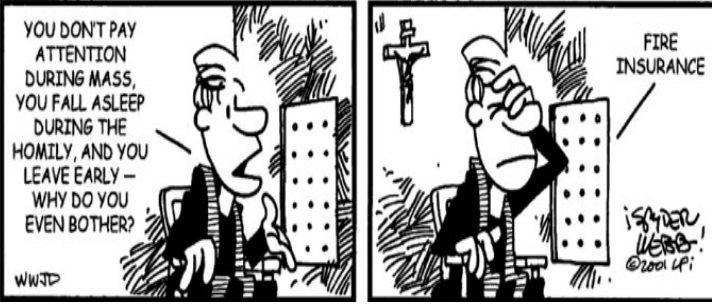

CLERGY REFLECTION

Today is the beginning of quite a week to celebrate saints from many different times, with many different gifts and with varying degrees of notoriety within the church and beyond.

Today (**Sunday, August 24th**) is the feast of St. Bartholomew. Because his feast falls on Sunday this year, his day will go largely unnoticed among even the most faithful. In fact, we know little about Bartholomew even though he was named as one of the twelve apostles. Like most of the apostles, we know almost nothing for certain about him after Christ's death and resurrection other than that he was likely martyred while spreading the Good News.

On **August 25th** we remember St. Louis and St. Joseph Calasanz. Louis became King of France at a very young age. We are told that he married and raised eleven children, "carefully instructing them in how to live a Christian life." He was also known for being a king who had great love for the poor.

We know even less about St. Joseph Calasanz, but we know he dedicated himself to the education of the poor. Because of his success, he bore many attacks against him by those who were jealous of his success.

August 27 we remember St. Monica and on **August 28** her son, St. Augustine. Monica is a model of persistence in prayer for the conversion of her son, and Augustine is a Doctor of the Church, one of our most prolific writers and philosophers. Quite possibly, we would have not received any of those gifts from Augustine if it hadn't been for the persistence of Monica's prayers for him.

Finally, **August 29th** is the Memorial of the beheading of John the Baptist. St. Bede the Venerable wrote that John suffered martyrdom "not because his persecutor demanded he should deny Christ, but only that he should remain silent about the truth."

These are all saints who dedicated themselves to serving God. They didn't have superhuman powers of their own but used what God gave them to glorify Him. That is what we are all called to do.

I love weeks like this one where we have an assortment of saints to relate to, but also a day when no specific saint is remembered (**note August 26th**). I wonder if that is God's way of telling us that he always has room for more saints. It is not up to us if the Church ever formally recognizes us as a saint with a special day. What is up to us is the way we live our life and use the gifts God gives us. Let us choose to glorify God in all things and we will be recognized as a saint in God's eyes, the only recognition that really matters.
