



CLERGY REFLECTION

Brothers and Sisters,

Today is a joyous day for the Church. Of course every Sunday is a little Easter, a day to recall the Resurrection, today holds a reminder for us that God's work has not ceased in the past 2,000 years. Pope Leo XIV is set to canonize two new saints: Pier Giorgio Frassati and Carlo Acutis this Sunday. These are the first two saints to be canonized by the new Pontiff, and there is much for us to glean from these two men.

Sharing in their Italian heritage, they had a love for pasta, pizza, and probably soccer (as any good Italian would). Yet they each had their own unique hobbies. Frassati, living in Turin, loved the mountains. He was known as being an avid hiker. Yet he did not merely like the beauty of the mountains, he loved that the beauty pointed him to the Creator. Acutis, being born in London but growing up in Italy, loved technology, especially video games. Yet he self-imposed limits on his usage to avoid addiction. Both loved creation properly, not for its own sake but to wonder at the Creator.

What these two, of course, held most in common was their sincere love for Jesus. Their hobbies mentioned above were never their gods. They used good things properly and in an ordered way. I think this is one of the main reasons that these two saints have such an important role to play: they were both lay men (Frassati was a 3rd Order Dominican, meaning a lay Dominican). We have recent witnesses of incredible saints who did incredible things in their lifetimes: St. Teresa of Calcutta and St. John Paul II readily come to mind. Yet it can be easy for us to "make excuses" of why we aren't like them - none of us are the pope or religious sisters in that sort of position. These two new canonized saints show the possibility for sanctity in the ordinary, daily life. While on earth, they were not well known outside of their local sphere of influence. It is not fame that has made them saints. Rather, it is their daily fidelity to God in prayer, their hunger and reverence for Jesus in the Eucharist, and their authentic love of their brothers and sisters that has added them to the ranks of heaven.

The Church is always in need of saints and witnesses. It is not just the duty of religious, popes, and priests. It is the call for each one of us, and it only happens with a humble, daily offering of our lives to God. May we rejoice in this great celebration and find in these two new saints a witness of hope for our time.
