CLERGY REFLECTION

My Cathedral Parish family, I want to thank you for your patience and perseverance as we continue with the deconstruction phase of our organ project. The disruptions have been minimal but noticeable. For example, Friday was “day 45” of daily Mass in the Chapel. Because of the limited space, Mass attendees have become “close friends” with one another. Pun intended. Seriously, I told daily Mass attendees to imagine themselves in the early days of Christianity, when Mass was celebrated in the small confines of a carved out room in a catacomb. The Chapel is not a catacomb, I know, but the comparison helps underscore the importance of the Holy Eucharist no matter the predicament we find ourselves in. We need Jesus daily, and Holy Mass – the source and summit of the Christian life – provides us with that encounter.

With the rectory restoration completed (there are some touch ups to be done as well as landscaping), and the new organ is on its way in a matter of weeks, I wanted to update you on the current status of the *Cathedral InSpires Campaign*. As of August 1, contributions received totaled \$8,781,109. This number includes pledge payments, gifts-in-kind and one estate gift designated for endowment. The outstanding pledge balance, that is contributions yet to be made on pledges, is \$1,970,834. As of August 1, we have made payments towards both projects totaling \$5,733,743: \$4,252,546 towards the Rectory Restoration Project and \$1,481,197 towards the Organ Project. We have one more \$500,000+ (the amount is dependent on the exchange rate) payment to make on the new organ, as well as general contingency costs associated with the project. The success of the campaign is a tribute to the immense generosity of you, the parishioners, and the many “friends and benefactors” of the Cathedral. I cannot put into words how grateful I am for the outpouring of generosity towards these endeavors. People love our Cathedral and their priests! I also thank the Catholic Foundation of Eastern South Dakota for structuring the campaign in such a way that we were able to avoid borrowing money from the Diocesan Expansion Fund in order to make our timely progress payments. It has also allowed us to put \$1,327,046 of contributions received into endowments, which allows us to be good stewards of what has been entrusted to us for the upkeep of both the rectory and the organ. Estate gifts given to the Campaign will allow more to be put into endowments as time goes on.

I realize these past two years have been chaotic given both projects, however, when it is all said and done, we will appreciate the crosses we had to carry. The pain of it all reminds us that we don't do these projects for ourselves as much as we do them for the generations who will come after us. St. Joseph pray for us! Miraculous Infant Jesus of Prague, give us your blessing!
