



CLERGY REFLECTION




Recently, I posted an update on the *InSpires* contributions that have been received, and those pledges yet to come in. Again, my thanks to the parishioners, and the friends & benefactors of the Cathedral who have made our capital projects a reality via their great generosity. As a matter of transparency, I want to share the *InSpires* campaign expenses with you, so that you know where money received as been spent/invested thus far. Below are the breakdowns:

Rectory	\$4,254,138
Organ	\$1,545,594
Total	\$5,799,732

We have additional payments to make on the organ project. We budgeted the rectory restoration at \$3.8 million. As you can see, the restoration was over budget due to a variety of factors: costs of materials, add-ons on our part to ensure that the project was done right, ensuring the restoration's durability. When you get into these restoration projects you never know what you are going to find. We are happy, however that most of the costs are on target and within our budget, allowing us to put money into endowments for the care and maintenance of both the rectory and the organ.

In our Gospel for this weekend, Jesus talks about the gift of faith, and how faith the size of a mustard seed can accomplish deeds that seem insurmountable. Not too long ago, I felt we were facing objectives that were

insurmountable, but because of the faith of our people, we are ensuring the good of our Cathedral for the benefit of future generations.
