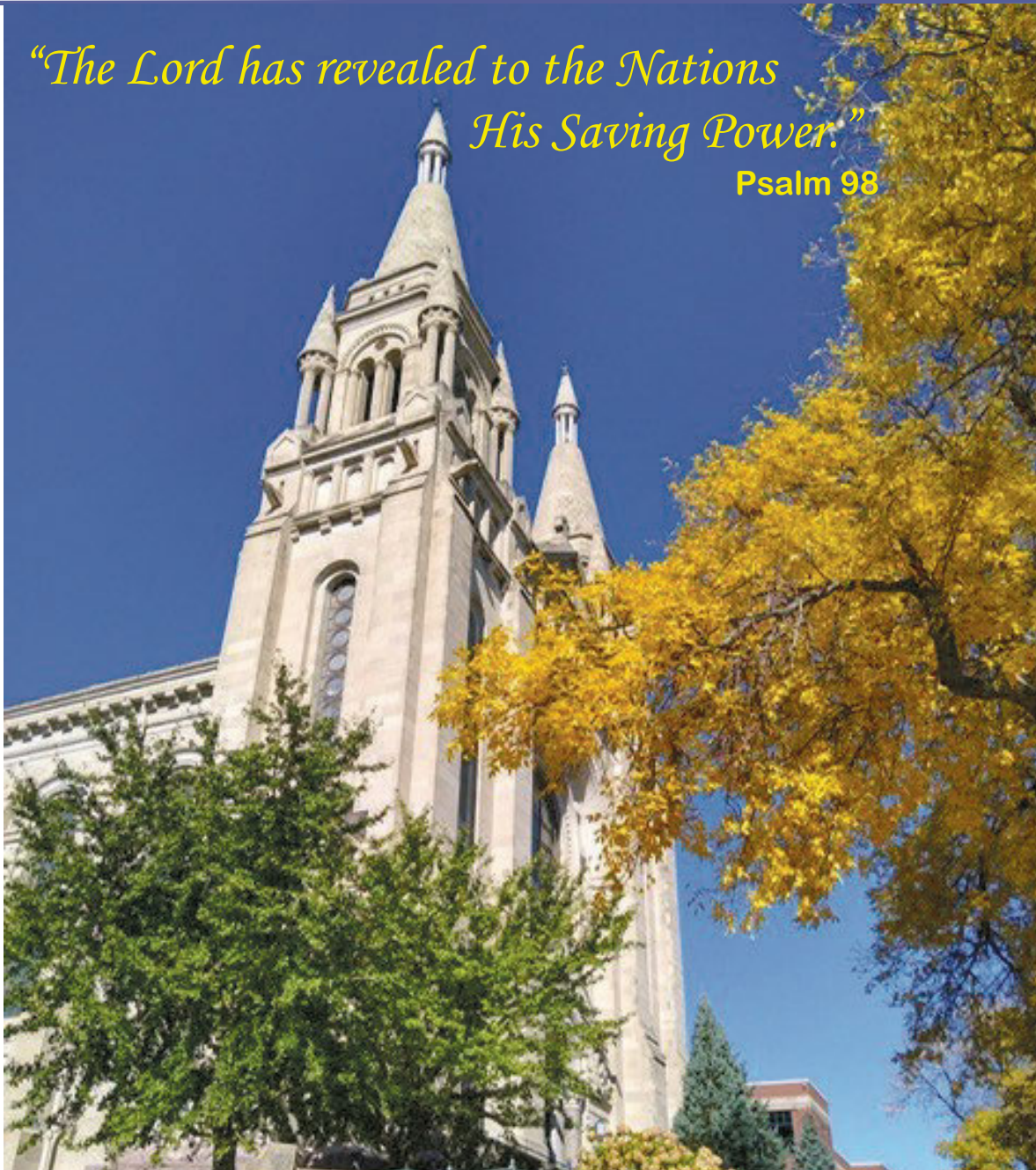

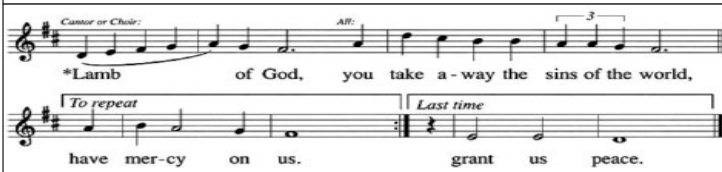

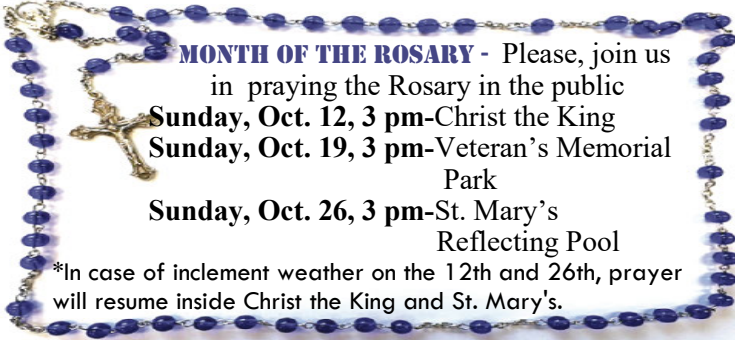
Parish Outreach Project

CLERGY REFLECTION

Thank God we have a new sound system at the Cathedral. We know that Jesus was not using any sound system to preach and teach but could preach to crowds unceasingly. The question is do the churches need a sound system? Yes, an effective worship and minister needs an effective sound system. In facilitating communication, the sound systems enable better communication for ministers, speakers, and musicians by providing microphones and amplification, which is crucial for conveying messages effectively. A sound system has legitimate purpose only when it effectively serves both the performer and the audience. It is not there to be served, but to be a servant. Whenever a sound system or its operation impairs the performance of a minister, or hinders the listening of a congregation, it has lost its reason for existing. The sound operator must be acutely aware of this fact and be sensitive to the needs of both.

A priest from Redemptorist Brothers whom we stayed with in Nairobi, Kenya used to make a lot of jokes and fun of me. One day he says, "Do you know qualifications to be a bishop? These are the requirements; 1st you have to have a loud voice, 2nd you must have a bald head, 3rd you must have a big belly." And he looked at me and said "you are qualified for that." That was a great joke which was made to African seminarians. The truth is that I used to have a good sound and a loud voice but with relocating and changing from hot weather to cold weather I lost my personal sound system but, now I am so glad that we have a good sound system.

Sound systems matter in proclaiming the good news and some people even though there is no sound system can reach out, like Jesus and the apostles. We should think about that.

We also need to lift up our voices to reach out to God, our Lord, as we have seen in today's Gospel. The ten leprous men lifted up their voices to Jesus saying, "Jesus, Teacher, take pity on us." (Luke 17:13)
