



THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12

The angel brought me back to the entrance of the temple, and I saw water flowing out from beneath the threshold of the temple toward the east, for the façade of the temple was toward the east; the water flowed down from the southern side of the temple, south of the altar.

He led me outside by the north gate, and around to the outer gate facing the east, where I saw water trickling from the southern side.

He said to me,

CLERGY REFLECTION

“Ongoing formation is an indispensable requirement in the life of every priest and in his exercise of the priestly ministry” (The Gift of the Priestly Vocation, IV.56).

On July 1st, I began my 11th year as your Rector at the Cathedral. Ten years ago when I arrived, I was tasked with the mission to guide and grow the parish, and to complete two monumental capital projects (along with their endowments) as a part of my tenure here. By the of grace God, all of this continues to become a reality. It has been accomplished by the graciousness and generosity of you, the parishioners, and so many “friends” of the Cathedral who stepped up to ensure the Cathedral’s mission. Also, as everyone knows, you are only as good as the people who are at your side. Staff and volunteers are responsible for these accomplishments and the fulfillment of the Cathedral’s mission as much as anybody else, me included. I have expressed my extreme gratitude to all of you before on this page, and now I do it again.

Last January I asked Bishop DeGrood if he would allow me to take a sabbatical. Bishop graciously, and with full support, gave me that permission. So on January 4th, I will be leaving for Rome and will be away from the parish until after Easter. I will be at my old stomping grounds, the North American College near the Vatican, where I attended seminary back in the day. My time will be spent attending the Institute of Continuing Theological Education, which is located within the College complex. I will be taking a variety of classes in theology, spirituality and priestly renewal. Yes, there will be study, but there will also be rest involved, something I pine for right now.

You will be in good hands in my absence. Fr. Chuck Cimpl has agreed to be the Administrator of the parish while I’m gone. Frs. Pasquale and Klein, along with Archbishop Gullickson, will attend to the liturgical needs of the Cathedral. I ask you to please be patient and understanding with them and my staff, given the circumstances. Please pray for them, and please pray for me, that my sabbatical will be fulfilling and renewing. Of course, in the Eternal City, I will be praying for each of you, and for the parish as a whole.

Today we celebrate the dedication of the Lateran Basilica, the first Christian Basilica built explicitly to gather a community of Christians around a bishop. The inscription at the top of the façade reads, “Christo Salvatori.” “Christ the Savior.” We are reminded that, no matter who is in charge, Christ is ALWAYS in charge.
